A PROPHETIC VOICE

Pope Francis has taken a risk. He has not taken the easy path. He challenges us about what has been forgotten; that all is connected. After all, the word 'religion' literally means to 're-ligament' or reconnect. On Friday, 1 September we began the 'Season of Creation'. It runs through to 4 October, the Feast of St Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology. The inspiration was the 1989 initiative of Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios 1, which the World Council of Churches extended from 1 September until 4 October. The Catholic Church joined in 2015. The initiative is "to see the world, not as something apart from us, but as a delicate interlocking set of relationships of which we are part" (Andrew Hamilton SJ). If you would like to see the Archdiocese's response to this awareness and more especially Pope Francis' Encyclical "Laudato Si - On Care For our Common Home' (2015), go to www.cre4creation.org. To undermine or abuse life-giving relationships is to sin, be it personal or social sin. Pope Francis therefore calls for right relationships or an 'integral ecology'. Further, the most deserving of our care are those most in need (cf. widows and orphans in the Scriptures). Care for those in need is the antithesis of pious individualism and self-justifying affirmation of the status quo. With respect to the mission of Jesus (and therefore our mission), and drawing on the

inspiration of Jeremiah, the reluctant prophet (Frist Reading), we see that "a prophet's role is to unmask the subterfuge and excuses through which people and indeed whole societies seek to hide painful truth from themselves" (Brendan Byrne). As the people rejected the words of Jeremiah, so too Peter, who acknowledged Jesus as the Messiah, cannot countenance that the Messiah will suffer and die. Yet it is only by entering into the pain and suffering of the world that Jesus can manifest the Father's will to identify with us, giving his life as a ransom, serving rather than being served (Matt 20:28). The irony is that Peter, whose earlier profession of faith was the rock of which the church is founded, is now the stumbling block! The stumbling blocks of today question the need for change of our outlook or actions. Lord, open us to the vision of an integral ecology after the teaching and example of Pope Francis. May he persevere in being the prophetic voice calling all to right relationship within ourselves, with others and with all creation. As you are one-yet-three, might we be one in the communion of your love. This we pray in the name of Jesus who came to serve, not to be serve.

THE AUSTRALIAN BISHOPS CONFERENCE HAVE RELEASED THE 2023-2024 STATEMENT "LISTEN, LEARN, LOVE – A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples": Prior to the call for a Voice referendum, the decision was made to address how the Church might further engagement with our Indigenous brothers and sisters. Bishop Vincent Long, Parramatta Diocese, notes "Whatever the outcome of this year's referendum, we ask the Church in Australia to make efforts to lead the way for our fellow Australians. Our attitudes and actions towards First Nations Peoples need to be grounded in justice, love, and humility. 'Doing justice, loving kindness and walking in humility' as the prophet long ago urges us."

CARMELITES DEPARTING CANBERRA: After fifty years in Red Hill, the Carmelites will depart in August next year. The Sisters departure is "due to diminishing numbers and no recent vocations." Archbishop Christopher noted that the Sisters' legacy "will continue, of course, not limited by time or distance."
