#### OUR LIFE IN COMMON

At the 4 May gathering at Marist College to consider what makes for 'human flourishing', social researcher Hugh Mackay noted that loneliness is a growing phenomenon, surprisingly amongst 18 - 25-year-olds especially. We are not made to go it alone. We are formed in community. Of course, choosing to be alone is quite different from loneliness. Jesus' disciples were concerned about their being left alone after his departure. He reassured them that they would not be left orphaned. The Holy Spirit, the Advocate would support and guide them as they sought to live as his disciples. As to the ultimate outcome of the reign of God, neither the time nor circumstance of its full manifestation were made manifest. It was clear that it would not be after the contemporary hopes for the social, political and economic restoration of Israel. Fast forward to 2023 and we have the ACT Government's decision to 'compulsorily acquire' Calvary Bruce. Where is God in this? On the side of life, surely (John 10:10)? Calvary has delivered on its agreement with the ACT Government. The ACT Government has nonetheless withdrawn from negotiations with the Little Company of Mary and decided to 'compulsorily acquire' Calvary Bruce, gagging debate in the ACT Legislative Assembly about its' decision, all the while claiming that religion has nothing to do with the matter. And so we are left wondering, why? What is your motivation Mr Barr? The ACT Government needs to recommence dialogue with the Little Company of Mary. The power to make a compulsory acquisition is not in question. The rationale to do so is. Indeed, for want of clarification, perhaps an injunction to make clear why the ACT Government arrived at the position they have would resolve the matter to the satisfaction of all Canberrans? The ultimate irony would be if the ACT Government in seeking to address future health needs of Canberrans excluded the Little Company of Mary on the basis of their affirmation of life from conception to natural death. And this from a government spruiking an inclusive agenda predicated on acceptance of diversity. The issues touch on our common good. We are formed in community. Diverse yes, but transparent and accountable, surely? Imposition without consultation fosters an 'us and them' mentality, the seed bed of further discontent. By last Thursday night 17 000 people had signed the electronic petition protesting the Government's decision re Calvary. If you would like to sign it go to www.savecalvary.com.au.
