STATE AND CHURCH

The Australian people have voted. Soon our 47th Federal Parliament will meet. Since federation our nation has known wars, economic depression, boom times, natural disasters, pandemics, and an openness to engage with the challenges and possibilities of a multi-cultural populace holding diverse religious beliefs, or none increasingly. We are yet to commit to an agreed understanding of Reconciliation with First Nations people. We are situated in the Asia-Pacific region, a middle power with long-standing allies in Europe and North America. As to what the Government should do, Father Andrew Hamilton SJ would have it that is a difficult question to answer because the major parties lack policies "to address the clear and pressing needs". Hamilton calls this "a recipe for paralysis". He proposes "a broad inquiry, free from lawyers and interest groups. It should enquire into what kind of Australia we shall leave to our children, say by the totemic year 2050. Its remit should be to show what we shall expect if we continue along the same path we now take, what needs to be done to shape a better future, and how to do it in an equitable way. That will give the Government a program for responsible rule" (Eureka Street). Strong words. As a nation evolves, so too does the Church's understanding of its mission. After all, faith is mediated through culture and the continuing challenge is the "separation of faith and culture" (Pope Paul VI). The Second Assembly of the Plenary Council of Australia will take place in Sydney, 3 – 9 July. The hope is to engender a new heart and initiatives which will rekindle

the mission of the Church as "a sign and instrument" of the reign of God. When leaving his followers, Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells them that the Holy Spirit "will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you". As a result, Jesus claims to offer "a peace that the world cannot give, this is my gift to you". Let us pray that the elected representatives of our 47th Parliament will enact legislation to further the dignity of every person. At the same time, we acknowledge that government is a means to an end, a vital enabler but not the end game. First and foremost, we take up the challenge to be who we ought to be. To paraphrase, St Mary of the Cross Mackillop: "Never see a need without doing something about it". Meanwhile, the vexed issue of contemporary church and state relations was played out in the rejection of religious discrimination legislation and when President Joe Biden, a Catholic personally opposed to abortion was attacked for the Democrats support of legalized abortion. The US Bishops considered but did not proceed with a ban on Biden receiving Holy Communion. In the foyer you will find a commentary on that and more so the relationship of church and state at law, 'The Politics of Communion. Bishops Must Not Bar Biden', The Tablet Editorial, 26 June 2021 (my underlined emphasis added).
