AGAIN, IT IS BOTH, AND

Taxes and death are said to be the only certainties in life. Facing the possibility of the latter in Jerusalem, today's Gospel has Jesus challenged about payment of the former. "If Jesus supports the payment of the highly unpopular poll tax, he will lose standing with the people. If he rejects payment, he runs the risk of being identified with groups (such as the those later known as Zealots) who were in more or less perpetual rebellion against Rome, and of appearing as a significant threat to peace and public order" (Brendan Byrne). Instead of responding to the either, or question, he resets the discussion. "Jesus takes possession of the religious and moral high ground by setting responsibility to the civil power (which he does not deny) within the broader and higher framework of obedience to God" (ibid). Much has been said about the result of last Saturday's referendum. So too about the conflict between Israel and Palestine. Where does obedience to God call us? Different folk of good will and good conscience have different views. Fr Frank Brennan SJ, a 'Yes' supporter, in his homily last Sunday noted, "The NO vote is not indicative of a racist or stupid nation. It is the sure sign that we the people were not presented with a proposal for change sufficiently safe and certain... This referendum was nothing like the 1967 referendum. It was nothing like the same sex plebiscite ... In both these votes, we were voting to treat everyone the same. This referendum was nothing of the sort. In fact,

it was probably the exact opposite. On one reading, the 60% NO Vote was a decision once again to treat everyone the same, declining to set up a new constitutional entity available only to one group, namely the First Australians." In time Brennan hopes for such recognition, aware that the majority "still need to be convinced that any permanent special provision should be more than minimal, symbolic recognition." Meanwhile, the many challenges in closing the gap beckon. With respect to the conflict between Israel and Palestine, Pope Francis has called for a World Day of Prayer for Peace this Friday, 27 October. We will offer the 9.30am Friday Mass for that intention. The Vatican Synod on Synodality continues under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. One commentator noted that the Synod was more about the sharing of personal experiences than ideas. We each have a story and we need to walk together. The challenge is to therefore both listen and to respond such that all are invited. Not all will be on the same page. We pray that love and truth rather than selfishness and deceit prevail under God's grace. And on that note, today we celebrate World Mission Sunday with the theme, "Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move". The mission includes each of us. Today we are invited to prayerfully and practically support projects in health care, education, and faith formation in Australia and overseas.
