## TO BE COMPASSION IN WORD AND ACTION

**Public speaking is a challenge, especially for the uninitiated. My first homily or talk during a Mass was in St Mary's, Young.** It was a hot and very dry Saturday evening. I was a deacon, nervous and sweating. Sitting down after two minutes, Fr Mick Burke remarked that they would love me if I could keep it to that in the future! I haven't, though I note that Jesus kept his opening address short too. Luke's arrangement of the (Greek rather than the Hebrew) text of Isaiah in today's Gospel reveals that liberation of *all* brings insight or enlightenment for *all*:

- A good news to the poor
- B release to the captives
- C SIGHT TO THE BLIND
- B1 freedom to the oppressed
- A1 proclaim year of the Lord's favour.

"This concentric arrangement of ideas leads a reader or listener to realize that the ideas of line A and A1 are similar, and the ideas of B and B1 are similar. Line C stands out as the focal point of the verses" (John J Pilch, p. 25). Luke calls all to see anew in the light of Jesus. That is little wonder as Luke wrote for a Gentile or non-Jewish audience. He also wrote the Acts of the Apostles, the companion volume to his Gospel.



**Behind a rostrum or not, our words and actions speak.** Actions speak louder but words now have so many avenues to put down or to build up. Perhaps I am minding my p's and q's but not making any real difference? **The ministry of Jesus however began in compassion (***'com-passion' is to 'suffer with'***), not indifference**. *"Why did Jesus do this? What would make a middle-class man talk to beggars and mix socially with the poor? What would make a prophet associate with the rabble who knew nothing about the law? The answer comes across very clearly in the gospels: compassion" (Albert Nolan Op, 'Jesus before Christianity',* 

1992, p. 28). Who am I called to identify with and bring solace, a sense of jubilee or release from moral or physical burden? I bet we don't have to look far to find instances. We might well identify some causes of oppression within ourselves and our community. As we approach Australia Day, whether of ancient, Anglo-Celtic, European or more recent arrival still, we can all own aspects that undermine respect for ourselves and one another. Perhaps in a twist of perverse irony, we take heart that Jesus' neighbours rejected him too. But they missed out. Pity to keep repeating the mistake. Advance Australia Fair!
