CHILDREN OF GOD CELEBRATING THE SON'S BIRTH

Today we gather. At Christmas we share time with loved ones and that is good. We are formed in relationship. And in those relationships and in all of creation, God is present and seeking to engage. In 336AD Christians chose 25 December to celebrate Christmas. The symbolism of the sun in the Roman Empire, festivities surrounding the winter solstice and the shift from a lunar to a solar calendar were all influential in that decision. Faith is always mediated through culture. In the thirteenth century St Francis of Assisi created what we know as 'the nativity scene', using live animals to bring home to a peasant audience the great truth that 'God-is-with-us'. Fast forward and for a growing number, Santa Claus (with origins in St Nicholas) is synonymous with gift giving without any religious significance. That can be good but it is far from the full story of Christmas. Indeed, we gather to remember and to celebrate that the hoped for Messiah of the line of David, 'Emmanuel' or 'God-with-us' is born like any child but with the status of "Saviour", and that title has personal and cosmic significance. In the Greco-Roman world the title of 'saviour' was appropriated to those rulers who brought peace and prosperity. Augustus, emperor when Jesus was born, was so acclaimed. However, Jesus did not come to usurp civil authority but rather to affirm that *"the true peace for which* the world longs can only flow from the divine favour that the ministry of Jesus will bring" (Brendan Byrne). In fact, born outside Bethlehem, there being no room in the lodgings for travellers, his birth is first acknowledged by 'outsiders', the shepherds. A pattern begins which is realized time and again in his ministry. He will die on a hill outside Jerusalem, rejected by political and religious authorities. It is the 'little people', Zechariah in the temple, Mary and now the shepherds who praise God for having vindicated what they were told. "Salvation, then, has essentially to do with a sense that God is faithful. It connotes, to be sure, the attainment of eternal life. But it begins when people discern instances of God's faithfulness in their lives. These instances then become "signs" of a more complete measure of salvation to come" (Byrne). This awareness evokes a child-like not childish trust, as German theologian Hans von Balthasar reflected: "To be a child means to owe one's existence to another, and even in our adult life we never quite reach the point where we no longer have to give thanks for being the person we are." As maturing adults in awe with children around the Christ-child, we celebrate the outpouring of God's saving grace on the entire world. We 'walk together' with all people of good will into a hope-filled future.
