#### A GRACED JOURNEY

We need markers. We need signposts that reassure and challenge us on life's journey. Lent is such a time for the family of faith. Scripturally, Lent recalls the Chosen People's forty years testing in the desert and Jesus' forty days of testing before his public ministry (today's Gospel). In the early Church the proximate preparation or spiritual testing of those preparing to be received into the Church at Easter morphed into a time of preparation for all the faithful to be renewed in awareness of their baptismal dignity which we celebrate anew each Easter. It is awareness of and action consistent with that dignity that we seek to nurture by prayer, works of charity and alms giving. Ashes on the forehead, Project Compassion (boxes/envelopes for each household available at the exits) and personal resolve about some matter(s) are graced responses to the movement of God's Spirit. Pope Francis has compared the Lenten journey to that of the call to synodality. Both are journeys and both affirm that we journey together open to the movement of God's Spirit. The beautiful symbol on the top of our bulletin, prepared by Emil Capper and colleagues at Holy Trinity School capture this. So too the stark Lenten presentation at the front of the altar, prepared by our Parish Liturgy Committee, is about letting go of that which hinders us on the journey. You will recall that Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast (for those aged 18 to 60) and abstinence (for those 14 and older). All the other

Fridays of Lent and throughout the year are days of spiritual renewal. Looking ahead, I note that our parish will host the **regional Lenten Second Rite**, **6pm**, **Tuesday**, **4 April**. May our prayer and good deeds over these forty days be a source of personal renewal and blessing for our communities.
