FAITHFUL WITNESS

Today's celebration of Christ the King marks the end of the liturgical year. Our readings focus on the notion of the 'Shepherd-King'. The neglect of those in leadership is understood to be the reason for God's people going into exile. Our First Reading from the prophet Ezekiel speaks of a future restoration of the people by God. The fulness of that promise was realised in Jesus, who self-describes as the Good Shepherd, willing to lay down his life for his sheep. In turn, the disciples of Jesus are to serve the needs of others. Hence, the understanding of the Gospel about the division of the sheep and goats at the last judgement is seen to be founded on whether - like the Good Shepherd - we reached out to those in need. The understanding is that in responding to the needy we are responding to Christ. Some scholars reject this humanitarian interpretation. Reginald H Fuller insists that the correct interpretation of the sheep and goats is found in the application of the "shaliach" principle. In effect, to reject the messenger (the Church) is to reject the message (the love of God). Fuller would maintain that judgement will be founded on the reception or rejection of the Church's proclamation of the gospel. Of course, this understanding begs the question as to whether the Gospel has been effectively communicated by the Church. Indeed, not too long ago the Church claimed that

there was no salvation outside the Church and "error has no rights". However, the Church's self-understanding now insists that the Church is "a sign and instrument" of salvation, elements of which are found outside the Church. Moreover, the Letter of James 2:14-20 insists that faith without works is dead. As one commentator notes: "There's no point telling poor people to 'have faith' if what they really need is food and clothing. So faith without action is useless." Marymead-CatholicCare employs over 600 people as an agency of the archdiocese providing varied services to the people of Canberra and beyond. They do so not just as another NGO but as a Catholic faith-inspired agency giving expression to values which all people of good will can resonate with. Perhaps a reconciliation of the different interpretations of today's Gospel is to be found in a 'both, and' understanding. The Church, you and me, is called to live our faith, to witness to it. Our everyday and down to earth witness affords others the opportunity to glimpse the love of God. So too we glimpse the presence of God in them, especially when they present as the broken, rejected Christ. In faith-inspired witness we all move forward the richer. The opportunities are many. Is our witness sufficient to them?
