THE NEED FOR 'OVERFLOW'

Today's First Reading and Gospel makes clear that Jesus is open to the movement of God's Spirit in anyone of good will. A presumption of the innate dignity of others underpinned this affirmation. However, for a variety of historical and theological reasons contrary to that understanding and to the detriment of ecumenical and inter-faith relations,

let alone engagement with wider society, the Church for years claimed to be 'the perfect society' and that there was 'no salvation outside the Church'. The Second Vatican Council (1962-1965) redressed that understanding. It spoke of the Church as 'a sign and instrument' of the reign of God. The Council claimed that the fulness of revelation is in the communion of the faithful and manifest in a hierarchy of truths (our understanding of which is open to development) but not thereby exhausted. The Council also therefore insisted on the religious freedom of all. The takeaway was to 'open the windows' and to seek dialogue with all of good will. Fast forward to today's celebration of Migrant and Refugee Sunday and next weekend's first meeting of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia and the thrust of the readings, along with the call of Pope Francis to 'synodality' ('walking together') are especially relevant. The desire or the necessity of folk to seek a new start in another country and the different perspectives within the family of faith call for communal discernment and action.

In 'Let Us Dream', (available at the Catholic Bookshop), Pope Francis says that dialogue, "a mutual exchange of gifts" is key. "The solution to an intractable problem comes in ways that are unexpected and unforeseen, the result of a new and greater creativity released, as it were, from the outside. This is what I mean by "overflow" because it breaks the banks that confined our thinking, and causes to pour forth, as if from an overflowing fountain, the answers that formerly the contraposition didn't let us see. We recognize that this process is a gift from God because it is the same action of the Spirit described in Scripture and evident in history" (p. 80). In that spirit of 'overflow', I share an 'Acknowledgment of Country' from Young Christian Students (YCS) for this Migrant and Refugee Sunday:

As we gather in this virtual space, we acknowledge the traditional custodians of the land on which we each are located. Their footsteps were here long before our shoeprints. Their handprints were here, centuries before our buildings rose. Their hearts loved and broke in this country generations before our hearts loved and broke. Their cultural authority and traditions were established long before our communities of relationships and leadership came to be. We call upon their spirit ancestors and our own ancestors who have gone to God, to be with us as we share, learn and celebrate together. May we live gently on this land. We also welcome Christ who comes to us as the visitor, the stranger, the young worker, the refugee, the asylum seeker, the migrant, and those who still offshore awaiting our welcome onshore.

I draw your attention to the attached notice of an invitation to the 'Call To Lamentation'.

The Plenary Council will engage 278 members meeting online in State hubs. They will be assisted by the work of 20 Expert Advisers, A Canonical ('Church Law') Committee, A Drafting Committee, A Steering Committee, A Secretariat, 11 Facilitators, 7 Chairpersons, 5 Observers, 1 President and more than 150 volunteers. It's big! Members from our Archdiocese are Archbishop Christopher, Brigid Cooney, Father Tony Percy, Sally Fitzgerald, Francis Sullivan, John Warhurst, and me. Sr Clare Condon SGS who regularly gathers with us here for Mass is one of the expert advisers. Once more, I commend the Plenary Council Prayer to you:

Come, Holy Spirit of Pentecost. Come Holy Spirit of the great South Land. O God, bless and unite all your people in Australia and guide us on the pilgrim way of the Plenary Council. Give us the grace to see your face in one another and to recognise Jesus, our companion on the road. Give us the courage to tell our stories and to speak boldly your truth. Give us ears to listen humbly to each other and a discerning heart to hear what you are saying. Lead your Church into a hope-filled future, that we may live the joy of the Gospel. Through Jesus Christ our Lord, bread for the journey from age to age. Our Lady Help of Christians, pray for us. St Mary MacKillop, pray for us.
