WHAT'S IN A NAME?

I read an article in which a distinction was made between how we relate to 'Jesus' and how we relate to 'Christ' (Fr Ronald Rolheiser, "Relating to both Jesus and Christ", 16 July 29023, reproduced in Catholic Outlook, Parramatta Diocese). Rolheiser points out that Christ is not the surname of Jesus. There is not a perfect identity between the two. "Jesus is a divine person inside the Trinity, someone who once walked this earth as a flesh and blood individual and who is now with the Father as part of the Godhead. And although he is also the key component inside the reality of Christ, Christ is more than Jesus. Christ is a mystery which also includes us, Jesus' followers on earth, the sacraments, the word (Scripture), and the church. Scripture is clear: We are the body of Christ on earth. We don't represent Christ, replace Christ, or are some vague mystical presence of Christ. We are the Body of Christ, as too are the Eucharist and the Word." Rolheiser goes on to contrast the Protestant emphasis on a personal relationship with Jesus and the Catholic emphasis on the church. He concludes by noting that we "must be about Jesus and Christ, that is, focused on a personal relationship with Jesus and participation in the historical incarnational mystery of Christ . . . No Christian can legitimately say, my discipleship consists wholly in a private relationship with Jesus, just as no Christian can

references in the four Gospels to the word 'church' (Matt 18:15-17 being the other). Our First Reading foreshadows the appointment of Peter (in Greek 'Petrus'), whose profession of faith is the rock ('petra') on which the church will be built. Peter's profession of faith was a gift which no amount of human understanding (cf. 'flesh and blood') could achieve. In company with Jesus, "the disciples are being drawn into a fellowship with the divine never before imagined or foreseen" (Brendan Byrne). Contrary to popular belief, the power of the keys is not about Peter at the pearly gates, but rather authoritative church teaching proclaimed with divine ratification. "Catholics need not read it triumphalistically but, along with other Christians, find in it above all an assurance that for all its human weaknesses and failings, the Church guards a supreme treasure and enjoys a divine guarantee" (ibid). As Rolheiser insists, this confidence must be complemented by a personal relationship with the person of Jesus. The truth of discipleship is both, not either, or.

THE AUSTRALIAN BISHOPS CONFERENCE HAVE RELEASED THE 2023-2024 STATEMENT "LISTEN, LEARN, LOVE – A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples" FOR THIS SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY: Prior to the call for a Voice referendum, the decision was made to address how the Church might further engagement with our Indigenous brothers and sisters. In releasing the Statement, Bishop Vincent Long, Parramatta Diocese, noted "Whatever the outcome of this year's referendum, we ask the Church in Australia to make efforts to lead the way for our fellow Australians. Our attitudes and actions towards First Nations Peoples need to be grounded in justice, love, and humility. 'Doing justice, loving kindness and walking in humility' as the prophet long ago urges us."
