#### TO LOOK WITHIN BEFORE LOOKING OUTWARD

Russia invades Ukraine. International sanctions follow. Loss of life and ongoing concern. We pray for an end to hostilities and peace founded on justice. The former is desired by all, though what the latter would look like is a disputed matter. Relationships, personal and national are complex and ever evolving. Today's readings offer perennial food for thought, and not just for the faithful. In all relationships we need to look where we are coming from. The Scriptures understand the heart as 'the life principle' not the symbol of romance we usually associate it with (cf. Valentine's Day). And so we read, "For where your treasure is, there will be your heart also" (Matt 6:21). Where is your heart, or more colloquially, 'where am I coming from?' Brendan Byrne comments: "it is hard to know what is in one's own heart – to recognise the 'plank' that may be there, inhibiting vision and right judgement. Yet, even with such impediment, we are still so confident that we can see and set about rooting out the failings of others. If God, who really does see the heart, acts with such generosity, understanding and compassion, then that – not

judgement and condemnation – should surely be the model for human interaction." In matters of inter-personal, religious and political judgement we "must proceed from conversion of heart, and a truly humble and accurate appraisal of oneself. Otherwise, it will be simply dangerous and destructive." Violence, which can take many forms, be it between nations or individuals or couples begets violence. And yet there is a right to self-defence. Better that the aggressor stops. The judgement of the international community is clear: a preemptive strike by Russia founded on alleged and unsubstantiated concerns – the plank in their eye – does not justify their aggression. They should withdraw. What response will bring about an end to hostilities and a negotiated peace which all can live with? More immediately, we pray for an end to hostilities and the tragic loss of innocent life, heeding the call of Pope Francis to do so this Ash Wednesday especially. Only with the end of hostilities can all look within and without in seeking justice as the basis for peaceful co-existence. Naïve, some would say. An ideal worth pursuing in this instance and all others is my response. Besides, the alternative is the abyss of darkness. Did someone say Taiwan? And what about Afghanistan and Myanmar?
