COMMUNION WITH ALL

FOMO ('fear of missing out') is evident in today's Gospel. The older son resents the father's largesse after the return of his younger wayward or 'prodigal' son. This parable is "the final and largest of the three parables in Luke 15 (the first being the Lost Sheep, the second the Lost Coin). Jesus tells all three as a defence against criticisms of the welcome he gives to "tax collectors (social outcasts) and sinners" and his "eating with them" – his celebration with them of their discovery of the mercy and hospitality of God" (Brendan Byrne). In a spirit of generosity, the father had deferred to the younger son's request for his inheritance. He did so aware that the request was tantamount to wishing him dead. Nonetheless, he longs for his younger son's return and welcomes him with open arms. Having later assured the dutiful older son of his generosity, the father invites him into the party to celebrate his brother's return. As if to ask us whether we too are willing to trust the promise of God's generosity to all, we are not told if the older son went in. The younger son trusted in his father's mercy and returned home, will the older son do the same and join the celebration? Will he, will we accept the father's or God's love, "a God who displays love to an extravagant and, humanly speaking, foolish degree" (Byrne). Of course, we are all at times the selfish younger son, the returned prodigal and the resentful but reassured and challenged older son. The love of our heavenly Father reaches out to

all in all circumstances. Something of the Father's desire for the communion with all was manifest in Pope Francis' Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary (25 March, Solemnity of the Annunciation). Addressing Mary, Mother of all, Pope Francis stated in part: "At this hour a weary and distraught humanity stands with you beneath the cross, needing to entrust itself to you and, through you to consecrate itself to Christ. The people of Ukraine and Russia, who venerate you with great love, now turn to you, even as your heart beats with compassion for them and for all those peoples decimated by war, hunger, injustice and poverty. Therefore, Mother of God and our Mother, to your Immaculate Heart we solemnly entrust and consecrate ourselves, the Church and all humanity, especially Russia and Ukraine." We join Pope Francis and the Church universal in prayer and fasting for an end to hostilities in Ukraine. We do so as a people of hope on this Laetare / 'Rejoice' Sunday when we anticipate the joy of Easter.
