TO BE SET FREE

Mindful of Mark's theme of Jesus 'the stronger one' whose mission is to bind up 'the demonic', today's Gospel has Jesus cure a man possessed. The people are impressed and acknowledge that he teaches with authority. The life and ministry of Jesus is an instance of that prophet foretold by Moses in our First Reading but so much more powerful than Moses foresaw. In fact, while Jesus' power was manifest in this particular incident, it reflected the liberation that was being offered to all present. "Captivities' of prejudice, fears, scruples, guilts, ignorance about God, were dragged out of them. Far beyond overt cases of possession, the demonic can refer to any condition that controls human lives, inhibiting freedom and choice, stunting personal growth, alienating persons from God and their true humanity, rendering relationships with others poisonous or destructive. Addictions of all kinds come to mind, their destructiveness symbolised in the 'convulsions' inflicted on the man in this scene by the demon as it left him. Rather than being mere spectators of what is being described, the Gospel invites those who hear it to identify with Jesus' audience in the synagogue and to consider how their own lives need to be set free through the power and teaching of Jesus" (Brendan Byrne). While we are prone to see evil in others or particular situations, it is sobering that it can be present in us and

not noticed. This is perhaps understandable as 'the devil', 'satan' and 'lucifer' are all understood to seduce us into sin or falsehood. In other words, in the Australian idiom, we can all get 'sucked in' and not even realise it. In Church-speak, we might refer to this as the effects of 'Original Sin'. The need for prayerful reflection and especially for the reception of the Eucharist can assist us to see anew. It is not about being scrupulous. Rather, it is about an honest awareness in the light of Jesus' call and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And you shall renew the face of the earth.
