A WAITING PEOPLE

Today we begin the Season of Advent. Advent is about waiting. We wait for the Lord's coming in three ways: at the end of time, in a stable and in our lives and our world. Our First Reading has the prophet Jeremiah speak of restoration following the Babylonian exile. He references an ideal king of David's line. The early Church understood this to prefigure Jesus, born of the line of David. Fast forward past the earthly life, death and resurrection of Jesus and our Second Reading exhorts us to live the Gospel now. Again, our Gospel reading, with reference to apocalyptic imagery of Daniel, speaks of the future coming of Jesus with all those who have lived in union with him. We are exhorted to be attentive as we await the Lord's return. We do not await the literal arrival of Jesus on the clouds of heaven, but we are mindful of the need to be accountable for our response or lack of it. This sense of accountability is not just about us personally but our action for a more just and loving world. This sense of an inclusive preparation for the Lord's return is the initial focus of Advent. We then move to our proximate preparation for Christmas, though it is all connected as Jesuit scholar Brendan Byrne explains: "Advent is the season that honours and celebrates this waiting aspect of Christian life. Because we live in the time following the first coming of the Saviour, the prime focus of our waiting and our expectation is upon the second coming of the Lord. But because salvation is not complete, because we are so conscious of a world still ravaged by suffering and violence, we can identify with the prophets and holy men and women who hung upon the promise of salvation before the first coming of the

Lord. Their cries express our own longings and hopes for a liberated and just world." To wait in silence and action consistent with our founded hope is the essence of Advent. "We must wait for God long, meekly, in the wind and wet, in the thunder and lightning in the cold and dark. Wait, and he will come. He never comes to those who do not wait" (Frederick Faber, 1814-1863). The Advent wreath symbolises our waiting. The wreath's origin goes back to northern hemisphere celebrations of the ancients during the darkest and gloomiest days of the year when they burnt or festooned their wagon wheels with lights and greenery in anticipation of the return of their sun-god. We light candles on the wreath as we await the Saviour's return and look to celebrate the feast of light and life, the nativity of the Saviour. So too our Jesse Tree tells the story of salvation with reference to biblical figures and symbols.
