RELIGIOUS FREEDOM: A BLESSING FOR SOME, NOT ALL

Sheep dogs with their masters astride motorbikes or on horses or in four-wheel drive vehicles are the norm for gathering sheep in Australia. Those images are far removed from the practice of shepherds in the time of Jesus. Then the engagement was personal. Far fewer sheep for each shepherd and the sheep were often known by name. Having grazed during the day on open pastures, the sheep of a number of shepherds were enclosed at night for their protection. Thieves might attempt to enter the sheepfold in the hope that the sheep would follow their call. Next morning each shepherd would call his sheep and they would respond to his voice. King David, the first king of Judah and a former shepherd boy was called to rule over the people like a good shepherd. Few subsequent kings did so. The people lived in hope that the Messiah, Son of David, would be the 'Good Shepherd' par excellence. Unfortunately, today's Gospel from John 10 concludes before Jesus proclaims, "I am the Good Shepherd" (v. 10). Indeed, his sheep listen to his voice and he lays down his life for them. In the Gospel, he refers to himself as "the gate of the sheepfold" (v. 7). "By describing himself as 'the gate of the sheepfold' Jesus is indicating that only through vital and continual interaction with himself will members of the community find life and growth. In this sense he 'has come that they may have life and have it to the full', (v.10), that is, beyond life as mere existence, to have 'eternal life' that is a share in the undying life of God" (Brendan Byrne). With this understanding, we can grow in appreciation of the Sunday Eucharist as the source and summit of our lives. We gather for nurture, then go, responsive to the promptings

of the Holy Spirit as we seek to follow the call of the Good Shepherd who leads to fresh pastures and living water. This is not possible for an increasing number of Christians, as Siobhan Reeves from Aid to the Church in Need (ACN) will share with us today. Many Christians are persecuted for their faith and unable to gather and be renewed in faith. We give thanks for our religious freedom. We also pray for and otherwise support fellow Christians who no longer have that most basic freedom. Fr John
