OPEN TO CHANGE, TO CONVERSION

COVID has seen the notion of 'new normal' enter our lexicon. We don't do change well. Even if we understand the need for it. Besides, how long will this go on and what might be next? Bearing in mind our circumstance affords us sympathy for the crowd reaction to what Jesus called for in last Sunday's Gospel. Recall that empowered by the Spirit, Jesus stood up in the synagogue of Nazareth and claimed that he was "sent to bring good news to the poor... to proclaim the Lord's year of favour" (4:18-19). The tables were to be turned. "The point is that God's vision for humanity will challenge the present situation of the world, especially its established structures of power and advantage. Implementing the program set out by Jesus will entail a reversal of the current way things are: those who are on top will find themselves at the bottom: those who are at the centre will find themselves at the bottom: those who are at the centre Joseph, not God's anointed. His quoting the precedents of God's outreach through the prophets Elijah and Elisha does not cut it with them. He is about genuine conversion and they will have nothing of it. In fact, they seek to do away with him. He escapes, but

in time others will do away with him. "Today's gospel confronts the potential for violence that lies in every human heart when the boundaries of comfort and convention are challenged. It is a profound exploration of the conversion that full response to the gospel requires" (Byrne). Perhaps like me, you too can dumb down or simply refuse to engage with where God's Spirit sometimes calls. I note it was Jesus' neighbours who wanted to do away with him. The danger in 'practicing' our faith is – like the observant Jews in the synagogue of Nazareth - we presume to create God in our comfortable image and likeness. On the other hand, what if like Jeremiah, that most reluctant prophet, we took to heart the opening words of our First Reading: "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you; before you came to birth I consecrated you." To hear those words is to enter the dialogue of love (Second Reading). In love, and only in love, is conversion possible. Love calls out the best in us. Being a disciple or follower of Jesus is to be open to ongoing conversion. Openness and engagement or rejection and withdrawl remain the only options. Fr John
