OUT OF THE LABYRINTH

In the Good Friday Passion reading from John's Gospel we heard Peter deny Jesus three times. In today's Gospel Peter affirms his love for Jesus three times and is told to feed his sheep. The darkness of his denial is healed in the light of his encounter with the risen Lord. One commentator has recently reminded us that *"Resurrection is not resuscitation: it doesn't just restore the status quo. What many of us are longing for, in 2022, is a love that says yes to our pain, and carries us beyond it to something genuinely new" (Natasha Moore).* Pope Francis would have it that to move out of what he calls the labyrinth, *"we have to leave behind the 'selfie' culture and look at the eyes, faces, hands, and needs of those around us, and in this way find, too, our own faces, our own hands full of possibilities" ('Let Us Dream', p. 80).* On Friday we celebrated the feast of **St Catherine of Sienna (1347 – 1380).** This young woman of NW Italy was a mystic, Church reformer, writer and ambassador of peace. In 1970 Pope Paul VI declared her a Doctor of the Church. She famously said that *"All the way to heaven is heaven, because Jesus is the Way".* And again, *"If you are what you should be, you will set the world on fire."* Easter life is not same old, same old. Resurrection is not resuscitation. It is well to call this to mind today, 1 May, the feast of **St Joseph the Worker.** *"A worker such as St Joseph is not a mere lump of labour –'1.00 human work units'. He/she is a person . . . created in God's own image, and*

just as creation is an activity of God, so creation is an activity of the worker. The work we do echoes the glorious work that God has done. It may not be wasted; or abused; or improperly paid; or directed to wrong or pointless ends. To do any of these things is not oppression, it is a sacrilege" (from Universalis). Lord, like Peter who served in your name, might we and our elected representatives move out of the labyrinth of self-interest into new possibilities under the light of your risen life, life for all. In this regard, I commend to you the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference recent statement in which they echo the call of Pope Francis for "a better kind of politics, one at the service of the common good" (copies of the Statement are available in the foyer).

WELCOME to **Melissa Bray** and **Marianne O'Connor** who will assist at the altar pending their institution as Acolytes in due course. On your behalf, I thank Melissa and Marianne in pioneering this ministry for women in our parish following a long overdue change in Canon Law (Church Law).
