WHAT PROMOTES OUR DIGNITY?

Our readings are all about getting our priorities in order. Luke would have it that humans are insecure. As a result, we strive after wealth because of its perceived benefits. The peasant audience of Jesus, who are totally dependent on the whim of the weather, the landowner and the occupying Romans, would have been envious of the man who asks Jesus to settle a disputed inheritance. In reply, and to the liking of the audience, Jesus gives him a reality check in the parable of the rich man. His vast wealth will do him no good when out of the blue God asks for an account of his life. The point is to be 'rich' in God's sight as it "is the only relationship or attachment that can transcend the barrier of death" (Brendan Byrne). Besides, the overriding desire to acquire and enhance wealth "erodes the concern for others that is the basis of community" (ibid). The point is that "a sense of the immense dignity that they [we] already have in a hidden sense should have a transformative effect upon the way we live now" (bid). It has been a revealing week. The Senate president wants the Lord's Prayer gone. A Senator will not subscribe to the acknowledgment of country. An NRL team wanted their players to wear a Gay Pride jumper. Some years back a cartoon of social commentator Michael Leunig had a person standing before a sign headed WARNING. It then read: 'THIS IS AN INCLUSIVE SOCIETY AND IF WE FEEL YOU ARE TALKING, THINKING OR BEHAVING IN A NON-INCLUSIVE WAY YOU WILL BE EXCLUDED'. Our dignity does not arise from subscribing to political correctness, especially if enforced. Our dignity and the dignity

of others arises from our innate worth. It is the basis of community. To that end, Archbishop Francis Carroll in 1989 at the Archdiocesan Synod, the first in Australia since the Second Vatican Council, spoke of the discernment of the Spirit. As opposed to a parliamentary or confrontational model in which numbers determine winners and losers, and lingering resentment, he called for all to contribute his or her part to the whole such that there is a consensus or a "a decision with which all members of the group can live gracefully". No one gets everything they want, but we can live and progress together. The challenge in our nation and in our Church is to listen respectfully in the belief that we will hear the movement of God's Spirit. We all belong and we have a contribution to make. Fr John
