## **FAITH LIVED IN COMMUNITY**

What does your day begin with? Tea or coffee? Morning show TV? Exercise? For the devout Jew, the answer would be the recitation of the Shema prayer (cf. First Reading and Gospel). 'Shema' means to listen, to obey. "Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God . . ." The people of the Mosaic covenant are called to listen and obey each day. Our idea of morning prayers harkens back to this priority. The love of God called for is all encompassing. "Heart', 'soul' and 'strength' refer not so much to separate capacities but together communicate a loving commitment that engages the totality of a person." (Brendan Byrne SJ). However, Jesus, with some later Jewish parallels, joins love of God to love of neighbour, though "they remain 'first' and 'second'. This signals that God is worthy of love and worship in an absolute sense; . . . [with this love] necessarily finding expression in love of neighbour." (Byrne). But what does it mean to love one's neighbour as oneself? Surely, a healthy love of self would want "understanding, tolerance, respect, loyalty and compassion" (Byrne). Then one must in turn show the same to the other. Our faith is lived in community or it is a faith not received. We live our faith in time and place, in relationship. The pandemic is a stark reminder of our inter-connectedness. No woman or man is an island. Friday was International Teachers Day. We give thanks for the efforts of teachers to nurture and guide

young folk with the knowledge, faith and values to serve both the common good and their individual good. Again, we pray for the outcomes of the 31 Oct – 12 Nov 2021 UN Climate Change Conference (COP26) being held in Glasgow, Scotland. As Pope Francis exhorts us, we must 'care for our common home'. Finally, on Monday, 1 November, All Saints Day, we will remember and seek the intercession of those who knew transformation in Christ and enhanced their communities in living that experience. On Tuesday, 2 November, All Souls Day, we will remember and pray for the repose of the repose of the souls of all those dear and near to us. May they rest in peace to rise in Easter glory. You are invited to add the names of deceased loved ones to the Book of Remembrance on the right side of the sanctuary during this month of the Holy Souls. Returning after lockdown, it is well to remind ourselves that the prioritized two-in-one commandment to love God and neighbour, sees us gather to worship as the 'community of communities', celebrating the 'source and summit' of our week, as we hold up in Christ the 'joys and sorrows' of our lives and our world.
