BEATITUDES LEAD TO JUSTICE

The 30 January – 5 February 'pilgrimage of peace' of Pope Francis to the Democratic Republic of Congo and South Sudan, the latter being with the Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby and Rev Iain Greenshields Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, finds resonance in today's readings. In our First Reading, the prophet Isaiah responds to the people's complaint that much fasting has not changed their circumstances. In response and in a manner that speaks to humanity down through the ages, he insists that if they get social justice right all will fall into place. The call upon the people is "to become a 'light to the nations' by modelling before the world what a truly human society should be" (Brendan Byrne). The predominant theme in the readings is light. To Christians perpetuating the darkness of violence in the Congo, Pope Francis said the Lord was telling them to "lay down your arms, embrace mercy . . . Do not be afraid to bury your wounds in mine". This is a call to live the Beatitudes. Moving on from last week's reading of the Beatitudes, we see Jesus draw on the images of salt and light. The city of Jerusalem was especially illumined during the Feast of Tabernacles. However, allusion to a lamp stand and to salt evoke a more personal and

domestic appreciation. As followers of Jesus, each of us is uniquely called to be a light and a catalyst for change.

By being beatitude people walking in trust and fostering right relationship we draw others to experience their true potential in the knowledge and love of God. Pope Francis is leading by example. A local endeavour to affirm the dignity and potential of all was manifest at last Monday's 'Faith in Learning' gathering of 2000 plus teachers of the Archdiocese. Noel Pearson, Aboriginal activist and Director of 'Good to Great Schools' in North Queensland, praised the evidence-based success of the archdiocesan Catalyst programme as "a beacon". Catalyst is founded in the science of learning and direct instruction. Pearson asked, "What do you think is going on in Alice Springs. That's the product of failed learning, which is the consequence of failed teaching in the communities from which these kids have come." Endeavouring to be salt and light will find resonance with all people of good will.
