LEADERSHIP AND EQUALITY

Today's readings target unworthy religious leaders. The prophet Malachi (First Reading) sees the conduct and corruption of the priests responsible for Temple worship after the people's return from exile as undermining right relationship with God and the people. In Matthew's Gospel Jesus is presented as the authorative interpreter of the Torah or the law. "The scribes and Pharisees bring to their interpretation of the Torah a host of rulings from their own tradition that, instead of making it something liveable and life-enhancing, actually make it burdensome and crushing" (Brendan Byrne). Jesus lampoons the habits of the religious leaders. Insisting on servant leadership after his own example, coming "not to be served, but to serve" (20:28), he rebuts honorific titles and practices suggesting otherwise. Scripture scholar Brendan Byrne notes that the Christian tradition "has not taken this instruction literally", with priests being addressed as "Father" or such. He believes that with the exposure of widespread clerical abuse and the failure of authorities to handle it responsibly, "the time has surely come to revisit the values and teaching enshrined" in honorific titles. The resultant contagion at worst is clericalism, manifest in presumption and action undermining the call to serve. This is one of the matters Pope Francis has been mindful of in the Synod on Synodality,

that concept insisting on all the faithful 'walking together'. However, a congregational or 'flat' church is not being proposed. We are 'a hierarchical communion' in which the ordained are called to a mission of service of the faithful to fulfill their mission in their homes, offices, factories, on the land and in their communities. However, affirming that still leaves the vexed question of the status of women in the Church. The Church insists that man and woman are made in God's image and equal in dignity. Thereafter the call for equality is replaced with that of 'complementarity'. Difference is emphasised. At best, the genius of woman is that which man is not. As a logical consequence, a woman cannot share in the fulness of ecclesial governance as that is reserved to ordained males, as are the fulness of sanctifying and teaching roles. At best, a non-ordained man and woman is called to 'assist' those ordained (Canon 228 Code of Canon Law). Again, complementarity based on difference. The theology, philosophy and anthropology underpinning this 'complementary' understanding are challenged by a contemporary critique. I would suggest that the differences, already present amongst those in the pews, to say nothing of those who have simply walked away, will be exacerbated at next year's second session of the Synod when proposals arising from the recently concluded first session are considered. In this, as is in all issues, "Where is the Spirit calling?"
