OPEN TO THE LIGHT

In 6th century Gaza, a young monk complained to Abbot Dorotheos that another monk had interrupted him while reading and made him angry. "You are wrong responds Dorotheos. He simply exposed the hidden anger you have within you. If you look at the matter sensibly, you should be grateful because he did you a service. He showed you that you have a problem hidden within you, a part of you where you do not possess the freedom and peace that Jesus has come to give" (from Paul Glynn's "The Wayside Stream - Reconciliation"). Today we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration, our parish feast day. The transfiguration of Jesus is a reassuring revelation and a challenge. A revelation in that it occurs on a high mountain, the traditional abode of God, and the whiteness of Jesus's clothes are synonymous with the heavenly realm. Further, the presence of Moses and Elijah, understood to be in heaven (Deut 34:6, 2K 2:11), confirms that "Peter, James and John are . . . given a glimpse of Jesus in the heavenly realm in which he is as much at home as in the earthly one shared with them" (Brendan Byrne). The experience reassures them, and in the words of our parish motto Peter proclaims, "Lord, it is wonderful for us to be here". However, the experience also challenges them as Jesus will descend from the mountain, take the path to Jerusalem and give over his life as servant

of God (20:28). "The two truths that Peter had found so difficult to reconcile with each other - that Jesus is the Son of the living God (16:16) and that he is destined to suffer and die (16:21) – are here held together in direct revelation from God" (ibid). Only after the resurrection did Peter come to realise that entry into the pain and suffering of the world was a necessary prelude to heavenly glory. "Faith in him [Jesus] and hope in the eventual triumph of his cause are the lamps [cf. 'dawn' and 'morning star' of our Second Reading] that continue to light our way in what is often the darkness of our times" (ibid). In the darkness of his anger the young monk was enlightened by Abbot Dorotheos. Might the morning star and dawning light move all to acclaim, "Lord, it is wonderful for us to be here."
