WORD OF GOD SUNDAY

The Australian Bishops have chosen the first Sunday of February to celebrate the 2019 call of Pope Francis for a 'Sunday of the Word of God'. This builds on the teaching of Vatican II that "the Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures as she has venerated the Lord's body" (DV 21). We experience this two-fold understanding each time we gather for Mass. The Liturgy of the Word is preceded by the Introductory Rites and followed by the Liturgy of the Eucharist and Dismissal. Only last week Pope Francis exhorted all Catholics to have a bible and to prayerfully reflect on God's Word. This follows the Second Vatican Council's insistence that preaching or 'breaking open' of the Word of God is the first duty of priests: "Priests, as co-workers with their bishops, have as their primary duty the proclamation of the gospel of God to all" (PO 4). Recent decades have seen Catholics grow in their knowledge and appreciation of the Scriptures, not the least through hearing the three-year Sunday and two-year weekday cycle of Scripture readings. However, the fifth century St Caesarius of Arles (Sermon 78:2) has a perennial question: "Which do you think more important – the word of God or the body of Christ? If you want to answer correctly, you must tell

me that the word of God is no less important than the body of Christ! How careful we are, when the body of Christ is distributed to us, not to let any bit of it fall to the ground from our hand! But we should be just as careful not to let slip from our hearts the word of God that is addressed to us, by thinking or speaking of something else. He (sic) will be no less guilty who listens negligently to the word of God than he (sic) who by his negligence allows the Lord's body to fall to the ground." In the same vein, St Jerome, Doctor of the Church and fourth century translator of the Bible into Latin (known as the 'Vulgate', being in the common or 'vulgar' language of the people), commented with reference to today's Gospel: "For me, the Gospel is the body of Christ; for me, the holy Scriptures are his teaching. And when he says: 'whoever does not eat my flesh and drink my blood' (In 6:53), even though these words can also be understood of the [eucharistic] Mystery, Christ's body and blood are really the word of Scripture, God's teaching." In union with Isaiah (First Reading), Paul (Second) and Peter (Gospel), we seek to be open and responsive: Lord, enlighten my heart and mind with your life-giving Word. As Word made flesh and food for the journey, grace me to be a sign and instrument of your presence. This I pray for your glory, my good and for justice, love and peace for all. Fr John

LOOKING BACK AND LOOKING AHEAD: On 1 February 1965 and 1 February 1968 the parishes of Holy Trinity, Curtin and Ss Peter and Paul Garran were respectively established. Nearly 28 years ago, on 6 August 1994, the parishes were amalgamated to form Transfiguration Parish, North Woden. Next Sunday, 13 February in the Parish Centre following a cuppa after the 9.30am Mass, there will be an open parish meeting. The aim is to canvass parishioners views on the Liturgical Committee's proposal for a 9.30am Sunday Mass at Ss Peter and Paul (date to be decided) to give thanks for the blessings of past Sunday morning Masses at Garran, to acknowledge the pain and grief for some in no longer doing so and to foster a renewed sense of parish as we move into the future. This would be followed by a social gathering, possibly in the school hall. Come to the meeting or make your views known in writing to the Parish Office. In passing, I also note that on 4 February 1973, the extended St Christopher's was dedicated as the Cathedral of the Archdiocese (established 1948), the original or 'old cathedral' being Ss Peter and Paul's, Goulburn.
