HERE AND HEREAFTER

At a funeral, children often comment that "Mum and Dad are now reunited in heaven". It is a commendable aspiration. However, today's readings make clear that while we experience God's love in and through each other, life beyond death completes our earthly experience of communion with God in categories beyond our current need and experience. This is foreshadowed in our First Reading (2 Macc 7:1-2, 9-14) where the brothers submit to gruesome torture confident that God's fidelity to the Chosen People will extend beyond death. In effect, they say to their torturers "Go your hardest, as God will provide beyond death and better to be at one with him than to deny our beliefs." The Gospel (Luke 20:27-38) has Jesus respond to the 'Dorothy Dixer" of the Sadducees. The latter did not believe in the resurrection. Drawing on the Torah, they note the requirement for the brother of a deceased husband to marry the widow and produce children. In their crass example of seven brothers all dying after marrying the woman, the question is whose wife will she be in heaven? Jesus points out two things. Firstly, the Sadducees question presumes (as my opening comment alluded to) "that life after death would simply be a repetition or extension of life in the present time, with the same conditions applying" (Brendan Byrne). Jesus points out that the risen life will be totally

new while fully human. In fact, "there is no longer any need for procreation and hence no need for marriage, the institution designed to supply it. If we look for a rich theology of marriage, we shall surely be disappointed. But Jesus is not downplaying the institution or denying that faithful marital relationship in this life finds no resonance in the life to come. He is simply refuting the Sadducees within their own terms of reference. Secondly, God seeks a relationship here and now that causes us "to enter into God's own eternal being and so necessarily transcends death. Ultimately, then, denial of the resurrection is a denial of God as Israel – and the whole Judeo-Christian tradition stemming from Israel – conceives God to be" (Byrne). To quote St Catherine of Sienna yet again, "It is heaven all the way to heaven". God is with us and we have a cherished experience of God's love through those nearest and dearest but our hope is for total fulfilment with God beyond death.

PRISON SUNDAY: Bishop Tim Norton, SVD, shares the following recent comment from Pope Francis "...when violence is met with forgiveness, even the hearts of those who have done wrong can be conquered by the love that triumphs over every form of evil. In this way, among the victims and among those who wronged them, God raises up true witnesses and workers of mercy." Pope Francis began his recent visit to Bahrain by appealing for a stronger commitment to human rights through the abolition of the death penalty and ending religious discrimination.
