WAY, TRUTH AND LIFE

"More farewells than Melba" is an old Australian expression reflective of the numerous farewells afforded Australia's most famous opera singer, Dame Nellie Melba. More recently one might think of 'The Seekers' or Johnny Farnham's 'last'/'farewell concert'. Today's Gospel is taken from Jesus' 'farewell discourse' in John 14-17. There are biblical precedents of farewell discourses from Jacob (Gen 49), Moses (Deut 31-33), Paul (Acts 20), and Jesus again (Lk 22). Such discourses speak of the future and possible death and the need to pass on the speaker's words. Scripture scholar John Dominic Crossan has summarized v 6 of today's Gospel, where Jesus speaks of himself as "the Way, the truth and the Life", as "I am the authentic (truth) vision (way) of existence (life)." Jesus' mission was to love in word and deed. To so live and die is the only way to encounter God. This was a message of

reassurance for the persecuted community of John who were denied access to the synagogue for their belief in Jesus. (Jn 9:22). "Such excommunication deprived these people of a community and a place that were dear to them. Moreover, it raised doubts about whether they really could meet God anywhere else. The synagogue, after all, represented God's chosen community. Jesus assures his disciples and through them all subsequent generations of believers: "If you know me, you will know my Father also" (John J Pilch). And yet Phillip still does not get it. He wants Jesus to reveal the Father (v.8). Philip had been personally called by Jesus. Later he brought Nathaniel to Jesus (Jn 1:43-48). Jesus asked Philip where they could buy food for the hungry multitude before the miracle of the loaves and fishes (Jn 6:1-15). Philip interceded on behalf of some fellow Greeks who wanted to meet Jesus (Jn 12:20-22). "Only against this background can one appreciate Jesus' disappointment: "You still do not know me!?" (ibid). Jesus goes to assure folk that his followers will do the works, even greater works, than he has done (v.12). "The works of Jesus are the works of God: to give life, and to restore meaning to life or enrich life's meaning. . . This is our challenge to engage in life-giving activities rather than death-dealing ones. This is also our challenge to put meaning into life rather than suck it out." (ibid).
