RUPTURED BY SIN, CALLED IN LOVE

The widow puts all she has in the Temple treasury. Great trust or further manipulation? Like the widow in our First Reading (1 Kings 17:10-16), Jesus commends her trust in God. And he laments it. "She has been taught "sacrificial giving" by her religious leaders, and that is the pity. These authorities promised to redistribute Temple collections to the needy. In actuality, they spent the funds on conspicuous consumption instead: long robes and banquets. This is how they 'devoured the estates of widows' (Mark 12:40)" (John J Pilch). Jesus goes on to predict that the Temple will be destroyed. The Romans did destroy it in 70AD. Besides, as our Second Reading notes the self-offering of Jesus makes the Temple redundant (Heb 9:24-28). Sadly, greed, manipulation and hypocrisy continue. Why? Because of sin. Pope Francis tells us that "sin is a rejection of the limits that love requires" ('Let Us Dream' 34). We live in relationship or we die slowly, alone and sad. Taking a 'helicopter view', Pope Francis reminds us that "human life is grounded in three fundamental and closely intertwined relationships: with God, with our neighbour and with the earth itself. According to the Bible, these three vital relationships have been

broken, both outwardly and within us. This rupture is sin" (Laudato Si 66). To be clear: sin is both a personal and a social reality. Sin has its' own punishment, virtue its' own reward. Little wonder then that Pope Francis called leaders at the recent COP26 gathering to take real action on climate change. He did so on the understanding of an 'integral ecology' or 'consistent ethic of life'. His insists that personal morality and our approach to the environment are two sides of the one coin. In fact, he claims, if we presume to divide issues of personal morality and those of the environment "we will remain stuck in the same lack of integrity that put us where we are now" ('Let Us Dream', 35). This integrated understanding extends beyond death. In this Month of the Holy Souls we pray for deceased loved ones. We pray for their openness* and ours to the love of God revealed in Jesus which conquered sin and death — or all that divides us - and calls us to the heavenly banquet, "so that God may be all in all" (1 Cor 15:28). Well might we pray, "May your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is heaven." * See foyer comment on November Plenary Indulgences.
