SPACIOUS NOT NARROW

Jesus again challenges the religious leaders. Last week he claimed that tax collectors and prostitutes were making their way into the kingdom ahead of them, like the son in the parable who initially said 'No' but thought about it and later went to work in his father's vineyard. Today's Gospel draws on Isaiah's reflections on his friend's vineyard (First Reading). Towards the end of today's Gospel, the vineyard image is replaced with an architectural one; Jesus, 'the stone rejected' by the religious authorities, is seen to be the keystone. The early Church understood their experience of the Risen Lord and the presence of the Spirit was such "that they can and ought produce the "fruits' that God desires from the 'vineyard'" (Brendan Byrne). So too for us and so too for those gathered with Pope Francis for the Synod on Synodality (cf. 'walking together'). By way of background, it is noteworthy that Matthew portrays Jesus as the 'New Moses', the one who came to reveal the true meaning of the law and the prophets. He 'cut to the chase', insisting on what was reflective of true love of God and neighbour. He attacked many accretions to the law which undermined the message of God's mercy. Pope Francis in his ministry and more especially the composition and methodology of the current Synod is trying to revive an openness to the call of the Holy Spirit in order to produce the fruits of the vineyard. His ministry has not been without opposition. Some months back five Cardinals

sought answers from Pope Francis about particular questions on women's ordination and the blessing of same-sex couples. They were not satisfied with the answers and called for a 'yes' or 'no' response. However, as Fr Timothy Ratcliffe, former Master of the Dominicans and one of two retreat leaders for the Synod participants reflected with them, "For some this is the fear of change, and for others, the fear that nothing will change." He went on to insist that "orthodoxy is spacious and heresy is narrow". Indeed, the Pope's response to the Cardinal's questions reflected an inclusive understanding. "The Pope's response includes an openness to the blessing of same-sex couples, provided this is not confused with a marriage liturgy. . . The Pope also suggested that the ban on women's ordination, while definitive, could be open to further study. His remarks reveal what has taken place under his pontificate. Francis has not changed doctrine, he's shifted the tone and opened the conversation. The Synod is now taking it forward. Buckle up for the ride" (Christopher Lamb, 'The Tablet', 7 October).
