# **INCLUSIVE HOSPITALITY**

Two outsiders are to the fore in today's readings. Both are cured of a skin complaint; Naaman, the powerful General in the First Reading and the Samaritan in the Gospel. However, the purity laws of the Old Testament Book of Leviticus 14-15 are about skin diseases which make "individuals, and the community "dirty", "impure" and "unclean" . . . History and anthropology rather than medicine and science help us to understand why our ancestors in the Faith were so concerned about this "leprosy"" (John J. Pilch). Essentially, the Chosen People understood themselves as being religiously pure and set apart. However, both the First Reading and Gospel manifest the universal scope of God's generosity. Naaman and the Samaritan, both foreigners, undergo a profound conversion and express sincere gratitude for their healing. Contrast this with the other nine of the Chosen People who were cured but who did not return to offer thanks. There has been much coverage of the forced resignation of Essendon CEO Andrew Thorburn. The issues turned on an exclusive or divisive either/or understanding of inclusion. Archbishop Peter Comensoli of Melbourne described the situation as "crazy". While we have legislation addressing Age, Disability, Racial and Sex Discrimination, we do not have a Religious Discrimination Act. Amongst others, Fr Frank Brenan SJ, Human Rights Lawyer, Archbishop Philip Frier, Anglican Archbishop of Melbourne and Tim Costello, former CEO of World Vision Australia, have all called for a Human Rights Bill. On ABC National Radio on Thursday Costello noted that Thornburn's

departure "triggered the culture wars." He went on to say "And then there's most of us, like me, who are the exhausted middle, who are going, "Who can win a culture war? What's the point of this?" He claimed that "A Bill of Rights is the mechanism to say how we actually settle this down and make sure that there is a legal framework for both respect and tolerance, and freedom of religion and conscience." God invites all to new life. The beauty, goodness and truth of such dialogue seeks the flouring of all.
