MARKETING OR TRUE MEANING?

A break with easter eggs, preceded by hot cross buns. A gathering with family and friends. For many (most?) this will be the sum of Easter. Nothing wrong with that but for those relative few still subscribing to the religious significance of Easter and the days preceding it, so much more is involved. We look back, we remember so as to engage here and now with life; life to the full in Jesus. Today, Passion (Palm) Sunday we begin the liturgical journey to Easter. We gather to bless palms. In the 'Gospel of Entry' (Lk 19:28-40) we hear of the Jesus' entry into Jerusalem ('the City of Peace'). His followers acclaim him as the one who brings heavenly peace. This is "a peace that is different from that which prevails in a purely political sense. It is a peace grounded in God ('heaven') and God's action, a peace that will meet with rejection from those whose interests it threatens" (Brendan Byrne). Indeed, our First Reading from Isaiah shows "how precisely as a suffering rather than a triumphant figure he fulfills God's purpose to save the world" (Byrne). Again, our Second Reading from Philippians shows that the disposition of Jesus "pre-incarnate, incarnate up to death, and post resurrection . . . is to pour himself out in self-emptying love" (ibid). He proclaims a kingdom "whose sole aim is the reconciliation (with God) and the enhancement of human life" (ibid). As the good thief on Calvary realises, the passion of Jesus promises hope in the midst of death. In fact, it is in dying with Jesus each day that we

are companions with him on his journey to the Father. *"Remember me when you come into your kingdom."* Yes, easter eggs, hot cross buns and gatherings are part of it, but not ends in themselves. To think so is to miss out on being renewed with life-giving awareness. May these days of Holy Week-Easter see us personally and communally renewed in the gift of life, life to the full, now and beyond death.
