WALKING IN LOVE AND JUSTICE

'Home'. The word evokes thoughts of comfort, belonging, safety. At this time of year many travel home to be with loved ones. If we cannot gather in person, we call, zoom or the like. Coming home is common to our Readings today. The beautiful vision of the prophet Isaiah in our First Reading speaks of Israel's return home from their exile in Babylon. "Because they are God's liberated people and because God will be at their head, leading them home like a shepherd, nature will transform itself to ease their path. A 'way' is being prepared, not just for Israel, but for God, whose glory will be made manifest to all humankind" (Brendan Byrne). Moving to the Gospel, to which the First Reading is always connected, John the Baptist calls the people not to a journey through the desert but one in the depths of their souls. They are being called home by way of right relationship with God and each other. John, and later Jesus, preached remission of debts (translated as "forgiveness of sins"). John's peasant audience was receptive as they were deeply in debt paying up to 40 per cent of agricultural production in taxes. "Each Advent invites us to revisit a longing for that 'home-coming' existing in the depths of our souls" (ibid). Our 'home-coming' is both personal and communal. The Gospel calls us to live in love and to therefore foster justice. To emphasise that John's baptism with water prepared 'a way', a receptivity if you will, Mark portrays John as akin to the Old Testament prophet Elijah in dress and hardy lifestyle, mindful that Elijah was expected to return and preach repentance before the Lord's

coming (Malachi 3:1; 4:5-6). Again, to show that John was the support act, Mark draws on rabbinic tradition where "students carried their teachers sandals as a sign of respect, but John is not worthy even to untie the sandals of the One who is to come" (ibid). Jesus, the One to come, "will 'baptise' with the Holy Spirit. He will bind up the 'strong man' (Satan; see 3:22-27) [and] "reclaim human lives from all captivities (sin, ignorance, disease, etc)... and draw them into his own life-giving intimacy with God. This is the true meaning of 'baptising with the Spirit'" (ibid). The One to come, not John, will usher in the dawn of salvation for all. And so, the beginning of Mark's Gospel does not, like that of Matthew and Luke, have the genealogy of Jesus but the startling claim that it is "about Jesus Christ, the Son of God" (1:1). God is with us and he leads us home. In him is our true freedom. Baptised in Christ and receptive to the Spirit's promptings, we are truly 'at home' when we walk in love and justice.
