TO LISTEN IS TO BE ENRICHED

I am out of isolation with COVID. Fortunately, I was not severely afflicted as many have been. During the week I was privileged to join the historic Second Assembly of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia online. There has been a genuine sense of seeking the movement of the Holy Spirit in the hope of being a more missionary Church after the example of Jesus. Within the diversity of people from across Australia, I grew in appreciation of the practical wisdom and good humour of the folk in my discussion group as we discerned a response to the tabled motions, namely, Monica Chahoud, Melkite Eparchy Sydney, Fr Tony Chiera, Bunbury WA, Deearne Gould, Geraldton WA, Ruth Lawlor, Bendigo Vic, Clalia Mar, Darwin and Fr Peter Slater, Sale Vic. They affirmed yet again that we are formed in relationship. On Wednesday the agenda was put on hold following a spontaneous protest against the deliberative vote of some bishops in undermining the required two-thirds support for two motions affirming the equal dignity of women and men. In football terms, one might suggest that the coach had lost the playing group as the prior consultative vote of members otherwise had supported the motions. The upshot was that the game plan was re-written and the motions passed later. In today's Gospel the priest and Levite ignore the injured man. They are caught up in their self-justifying rationale. However, life as a disciple calls me to respond to the movement of God's Spirit in prayer, in the

world about and in my encounters with others. What should I hold to and when do I need to let go and be enriched in doing so? The priest and the Levite could not let go and respond to the needs of the injured man. The Good Samaritan listened, acted and was enriched. Through honest engagement with God and each other, we follow the example of Jesus and further the mission of the Church. I do not sense that the outcomes of the Plenary Council will be immediate and dramatic. However, they will engender a more collaborative and considered approach to the Church's mission as we move into a hope-filled future. For now, we give thanks for the grace of the Plenary Council. We pray that in the implementation phase of the Council will see us respond under God's grace to the challenges and opportunities before the Church in Australia. More immediately, we pray for an end to the war in Ukraine, for provision of food for the hungry in Africa and for those in NSW impacted by devastating floods.
