SEND AWAY OR WALK WITH?

Regulating life in a community is not without its challenges. The Church is no different. Today's Gospel proposes a progression of procedures to engage with the errant, beginning with the private and moving to the increasingly public. However, if the person persists in behaviour at odds with that which is foundational to the community, the community has no alternative but to treat them as an outsider (cf. pagan or tax collector), and the faith community understands that decision as being divinely ratified. Clear enough, especially for the small persecuted early Church. Problem is that such a detached reading has caused not a few issues down the years. Besides, the force of excommunication has little impact on individuals today who insist on 'doing it my way'. Our Second Reading cautions that the debt of love owed to God as a result of his redemptive self-sacrifice compels "us to consider it owed to our fellow human beings, deserving or undeserving as they may be" (Brendan Byrne). When Jesus encountered the cowering woman caught in adultery, he did not look down on her as her jeering accusers did. To stand over her would be to take a

position of power. Instead, he stoops down and writes on the ground (we know not what). "He takes a lower position than hers. He does not threaten or intimidate. He does not relate to the woman as a sexual object but as a person with a capacity for freedom. This is how Jesus exercises authority and leadership: from a position of humility and respect" (Michael McGirr). Recently we celebrated the feasts of St Monica (27 August) and St Augustine (28 August). Monica was the mother of Augustine. She prayed that he would turn from his life of carnal and other indulgences. He did, and later reflected on his relationship with the Lord thus: "Too late have I loved you, O Beauty ever ancient, ever new, late have I loved you! You were within me, but I was outside, and it was there that I searched for you. In my unloveliness I plunged into lovely things which you created. You were with me, but I was not with you. Created things kept me from you; yet if they had not been in you they would not have been at all. You called, you shouted, and you broke through my deafness. . . . I have tasted you and now I hunger and thirst for more. You touched me and I burned for your peace" (St Augustine of Hippo, 'Confessions'). To witness, to pray for and to 'walk with' would seem the way to go. Fr John

THE AUSTRALIAN BISHOPS CONFERENCE HAVE RELEASED THE 2023-2024 STATEMENT "LISTEN, LEARN, LOVE – A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples": Prior to the call for a Voice referendum, the decision was made to address how the Church might further engagement with our Indigenous brothers and sisters. Bishop Vincent Long, Parramatta Diocese, notes "Whatever the outcome of this year's referendum, we ask the Church in Australia to make efforts to lead the way for our fellow Australians. Our attitudes and actions towards First Nations Peoples need to be grounded in justice, love, and humility. 'Doing justice, loving kindness and walking in humility' as the prophet long ago urges us."
