The Significance of Jesus' Baptism

The Baptism of the Jesus is celebrated by the Eastern churches on the feast of Epiphany and the Sunday after Epiphany in the West respectively with great importance. This is because, it is the occasion of the first public revelation of all the Three Persons of the Holy Trinity (reflected in the voice of the Father and the descent of the Spirit in the form of a dove), and the official revelation of Jesus as the Son of God to the world by God the Father, marking the beginning of his public ministry. Hence, it is described by all four Gospels.

This event remains very significant in Jesus' life. Firstly, it was a moment of identification with sinners. Sinless, Jesus received the baptism of repentance to identify himself with the people he came to save. Secondly, it was a moment of conviction about his identity and mission: that He is the Son of God and His mission was to preach the Good News of God's love and salvation to Israel, and eventually to us, and to atone for sins by becoming the "suffering servant." God the Father's words, "This is my beloved Son," taken from Psalm 2:17, revealed Jesus' identity as God's Son, and the words "with whom I am well pleased," from Isaiah 42:1 (referring to the "suffering servant"), pointed to Jesus' mission of atoning for the sins of the world by His suffering and death on the cross. Thirdly, it was a moment of equipment. The Holy Spirit equipped Jesus by descending on him in the form of a dove, giving him the power of preaching and healing. Fourthly, it was a moment of decision to begin his public ministry at the most opportune time after receiving the approval of his Heavenly Father as His beloved Son.

Implicatively, the baptism of Jesus reminds us of our *identity*: who we are and whose we are. By Baptism we become sons and daughters of God, brothers and sisters of Jesus, members of his Church, heirs of Heaven and temples of the Holy Spirit. In the words of St. Hippolytus, "he who descends with faith into the laver of regeneration, renounces the devil and commits the self to Christ, laying aside slavery to sin and puts on adoption, returning from the font gleaming like the sun, radiating righteousness as a child of God and coheir with Christ".

Jesus' baptism also reminds us of our mission: called to discipleship; to experience the presence of God within us, to acknowledge our own dignity as God's children, and to appreciate the Divine Presence in others by honoring them, loving them and serving them in all humility; to live as the children of God in thought, word and action; to lead holy and transparent Christian lives and not to desecrate our bodies (the temples of the Holy Spirit and members of Jesus' Body), by impurity, injustice, intolerance, jealousy or hatred; to accept both the good and the challenging experiences of life as the gifts of a loving Heavenly Father for our growth in holiness; and to grow daily in intimacy with Him by personal and family prayers, by meditative reading of the Word of God, by participating in the Holy Mass, and by frequenting the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

It is a day to thank God for the gifts and graces received in Baptism, to renew our Baptismal promises and to witness to Christ's "Good News" by our transparent Christian lives of service, love, mercy and forgiveness.
