COMPASSION, NOT CONDEMNATION

Compassion is at the heart of the season of Lent. A season within which we recall Gods compassion for humanity and make effort to extend the same to others in different ways including the ongoing giving through Project Compassion. Gods' compassion is expressly found at the heart of Jesus' incarnation and public ministry. In Mathews' Gospel 5. verse 48, he invited his audience to 'be compassionate as your heavenly Father is compassionate'. This permeate all of his teachings and actions. Compassion moved him to teach, heal, restore the bro-

ken and raised the dead. Indeed, Christ is the epitome of compassion. He is compassion per excellence!

In the story of the Prodigal Son, the father was full of compassion for his son, again, revealing Gods compassion for human vicissitude; His readiness to forgive sin, offering the sinner a second chance. This weekend, we find a similar story in the Gospel. A story of sin and forgiveness. It was about a woman caught in the act of adultery (John 8.1-8). In the episode, the accusers were ready to punish the accused by stoning after judging and condemning her to death not in the Court of the Sanbedrin or Pilate's Palace but in the public square

the Sanhedrin or Pilate's Palace but in the public square where Jesus was teaching. Unknown to them that with Jesus, there is mercy, compassion and liberation. Jesus reminded them of their deficiencies and guilt by making sinlessness the condition for throwing the first stone. He compelled the accusers to assess their own lives and to leave. Thus, he grants justice to the accusers and mercy to the sinful woman. This shows the inexhaustible mercy and compassion Jesus gives to repentant sinners knowing that, 'to err is human and to forgive is divine'.

Very often, people are subjected to hash treatments, bullied, denigrated, gossiped, judged and condemned in the public court as a result of gender orientation, social status, addictions, race or background, education, health conditions, culture, religion and perhaps pedigree. Sometimes, the circumstances are never taken into consideration. Like the condemned character in the story, there are many out there who suffer silently without any shoulders to lean on or ears to listen and to feel their invisible tears; they live with condemnation for life. Yet, those who condemn others are not innocent themselves.

Christ action, offers inspiration to all to show the same compassion to others around them and to live as forgiven people, actively seeking reconciliation with God and with one another instead of condemning them. This has visibly influenced our Parish and School vision and value at this time, the value of compassion. Our trademark is compassion and our commitment to compassionate actions will do more for the world than words.
