

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF HOLY WEEK

Lent is a season of forty days. This begins with Ash Wednesday, followed by the first to the fifth Sundays of lent. At the end of the fifth week of Lent, Holy Week is ushered in from Palm Sunday to the celebration of Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. This is also known as the Great and Holy Week in the Eastern Catholics and Orthodox Rite. Holy Week includes: Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday (also known as Maundy Thursday), Good Friday and Holy Saturday. Within this week, the three most important days are Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday together called the Easter Triduum. Before the revision of the liturgical calendar in 1969, Holy Week was the second week of Passiontide; in the current calendar, Passiontide is synonymous with Holy Week.

On Palm Sunday the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem to accomplish the Paschal Mystery is commemorated. The liturgy of this day summarises the events of Holy Week, while setting the mood for Christians. Traditionally, on Holy Thursday morning, the celebration of Chrism Mass takes place. For pastoral reasons many Particular Churches have adopted an earlier day in Holy Week to celebrate the Mass of Holy Chrism. At this mass, the Oils of the Catechumen and that of the sick are blessed, while the Oil of Chrism is consecrated by the Bishop surrounded by his



Good Friday reminds us of the saving passion of Jesus. On this day, there is no mass, because the actual mass takes place on the cross. However, we gather in the morning for the Via Crucis (Way of the Cross) and later in the afternoon for the Celebration of the Lord's Passion at 3pm. During this liturgy, the Word is proclaimed along with prayers, the Cross is venerated, communion is received, and all depart in silence. This silence continues through Holy Saturday evening when the Easter Vigil Mass of the Lord's Resurrection is celebrated with the mood of life, light, joy, victory and regeneration.

Significantly, while Holy Week is solemn and sorrowful, it anticipates the joy of Easter which brings the hope of human salvation to all creation.

In our parish, it is a weeklong retreat. And I wish to invite all parishioners and friends of our community to be a part of all activities this week leading to Easter. Wishing one and all a Happy Holy Week! -Fr. Martins
