...IT IS THE LORD (John 21.7)

This expression changed the world for a band of grieved men who were in search for meaning and answers after losing their friend, mentor and master to death at the hands of the leaders at the time. They bunched together for support. Perhaps, bored by retelling the same story, they went fishing led by Peter who was struggling with guilt as well as grief. They went back to the same point where Jesus had called them three year before. Unable to concentrate, they fished all night but caught nothing. At dawn, Jesus showed up, asked them for a catch and after paying out the nets, they hauled in over a hundred and fifty fish. At this, John, the beloved exclaimed, "It is the Lord!". Indeed, it was a moment of relief not only for Peter who would eventually use the opportunity to plead for forgiveness for the triple denial, but for all his colleagues.

May the Lord continue to be recognized at every breaking of the Word and the Bread in Eucharist.

MAY, THE MONTH OF MARY AND MOTHERS

The month of May has had a number of traditions and attributes over the years. In Civil Service, May 1st is considered to be Workers Day or May Day. On May 1st the Church's Liturgical Calendar offers provision for the celebration of St. Joseph the Worker. This celebration honours Joseph, the husband of Mary who provided for his family through his carpentry trade. It is also a recognition of the dignity of labour while acknowledging the place of Mary who looked after Jesus while Joseph laboured in the Carpentry Shop. No wonder, the Month of May is also celebrated as Mothers' month! Additionally, in May the Crowning of Mary has become a tradition.

During May devotions to the Blessed Virgin Mary refer to special Marian devotions held in the Catholic Church honouring the Virgin Mary as "the Queen of May". The practices include the daily recitation of the Rosary, placement of flowers at Marian Grotto and pilgrimage to places of Marian apparitions.

According to one source, the May devotions to Mary in its present form originated at Rome where Father Latomia of the Roman College of the Society of Jesus made a vow at the end of the eighteenth century to devote the month of May to Mary in response to the immorality of the students.

From Rome, the practice spread to the other Jesuit colleges and thence to nearly every Catholic church of the Latin Rite. In Rome by 1813, May devotions were held in as many as twenty churches. From Italy, May devotions soon spread to France. In Belgium, the May devotions, at least as a private devotion, were already known by 1803. The tradition of honouring Mary in a month-long May devotion spread eventually around the Roman Catholic world in the 19th century together with a month-long devotion to Jesus in June and the Rosary in October.

Another source claimed that, in Rome, towards the end of the eighteenth century, one fine evening in May a child of the poor gathered his companions around him and led them to a statue of Mary, before which a lamp was burning, as is the custom in that holy city. There, these fresh young voices sang the Litany of Our Lady. The next day, the little group, followed by other children, again gathered at the feet of the Mother of God. Next came their mothers, to join the little assembly. Soon, other groups were formed, and the devotion rapidly became popular. Holy souls, troubled by the disorderly conduct which always increases and becomes graver at the return of the pleasant springtime, saw in these growing practices the hand of God, and they cooperated with the designs of providence by approving and promoting this new devotion, as a public and solemn act of reparation. The Month of Mary was founded.

This is the month in which, in churches and individual homes, the most affectionate and fervent homage of prayers and devotions from the hearts of Christians are raised to Mary. During this month, pilgrimages, visits to churches dedicated to Mary, little sacrifices in her honour, periods of study and well-finished work offered up to her, and a more attentive recitation of the rosary abound.

While offering devotions to Mary, we specially recognize the place of mothers in the family and the community and honour all who support, care, and nurse life in every form and level.
