CELEBRATING THE LEGACIES OF ST BERNARD



Saints are said to be 'ordinary people who did ordinary things in an extraordinary way'. St. Bernard of Clairvaux (1090 - 20 August 1153), was one of them. He was a French abbot and a major leader in the reform of Benedictine Monasticism that caused the formation of the Cistercian Order. Bernard's parents were Tescelin de Fontaine, Lord of Fontaine-lès-Dijon, and Alèthe de Montbard, both members of the highest nobility of Burgundy. Bernard was the third of seven children, six boys and a girl. At the age of nine, he was sent to a school run by the secular Nuns (Saint-Vorles). Bernard was only nineteen years when his mother died. During his youth, he did not escape trying temptations and around this time he thought of retiring from the world and living a life of solitude and prayer.

After the death of his mother, Bernard sought admission into the Cistercian order. At the age of 22, while Bernard was at prayer in a

church, he felt the calling of God to enter the monastery of Cîteaux. Bernard's testimony was so irresistible that 30 of his friends, brothers, and relatives followed him into the monastic life. Bernard joined the Cistercian Order. He was sent to found a new abbey at an isolated clearing in a glen known as the Val d'Absinthe. According to tradition, Bernard founded the monastery in 1115, naming it Claire Vallée, which evolved into Clairvaux. The monastery, however, made rapid progress. Disciples flocked to it in great numbers and put themselves under the direction of St. Bernard. The reputation of his holiness soon attracted new monks, including his own father. His father and all his brothers entered Clairvaux to pursue religious life, leaving only his sister, who soon took the veil in the Benedictine nunnery.

In 1119, Bernard was present at the first general chapter of the order. Though not yet 30 years old, Bernard was listened to with the greatest attention and respect, especially when he developed his thoughts upon the revival of the primitive spirit of regularity and fervour in all the monastic orders. It was this general chapter that gave definitive form to the constitutions of the order and the regulations of the Charter of Charity for the Order. The zeal of Bernard extended to the bishops, the clergy, and lay people.

While, remaining a pillar to his Order, Bernard contributed to the Church of Rome, He defended the rights of the Church against the encroachments of kings and princes. After the death of Honorius II, 14 February 1130, schism broke out in the Church by the election of two popes, Pope Innocent II and Antipope Anacletus II. By the end of 1131, Bernard worked hard "that all may be one". Also, in 1139, Bernard assisted at the Second Council of the Lateran.

Bernard had a great taste for literature and devoted himself for some time to poetry. His success in his studies won the admiration of his teachers. He wanted to excel in literature in order to take up the study of the scriptures. He had a special devotion to Mary and he would later write several works about the Queen of Heaven. Believing himself at last secure in his cloister, Bernard devoted himself with renewed vigour to the composition of the works which would win for him the title of "Doctor of the Church".

Also, Bernard sent bands of monks from his overcrowded monastery to mission in Europe and was responsible for the foundation of at least 163 monasteries in different parts of Europe.

Bernard died at age sixty-three on 20 August 1153, after forty years in the cloister. He was buried at the Clairvaux Abbey, but after its dissolution in 1792 his remains were transferred to Troyes. Bernard was named a Doctor of the Church in 1830 and considered by Pope Pius XII to be "The Last of the Church Fathers". So great was his reputation that Princes and Popes sought his advice, and even the enemies of the Church admired the holiness of his life and the greatness of his writings. Bernard's theology and Mariology continue to be of major importance, particularly within the Cistercian and Trappist orders. His Feast Day is celebrated on August 20th every year.

Through the intercession of St. Bernard, *may all be one*.


