2019 WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

Over one billion Catholics across the world celebrate World Mission Sunday this weekend. This annual celebration was instituted 93 years ago precisely in 1926 by Pope Pius XI. Every year since then, the Church has dedicated the month of October to reflection on and prayer for missions. Accord-

ingly, Catholics gather to celebrate the Eucharist and to contribute in support of the work of evangelisation around the world. This annual celebration gives us the opportunity of reflecting on the importance and the place of the ongoing mission of the church in the face of secularism, materialism and a consumerist culture in which God is not important, moral values are relative and organised religions are taken to be outdated.

According to Vatican Council II, the Church is "missionary in her very origin and nature". Jesus Christ was the first missionary. John 3:16 sums it up, "For God loved the world so much that He sent His only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not die but have eternal

In his 2019 World Mission Sunday message, Pope Francis declares that, "The Church is on a mission in the world, Baptized and Sent. This missionary mandate touches us personally: I am a mission, always; you are a mission, always; every baptised man and woman is a mission. Hence, Francis calls on all Catholics and the Church to revive missionary awareness and commitment as he declared October 2019 the Extraordinary month of mission in celebration of the 100th anniversary of Pope Benedict XV's Apostolic Letter "Maximum Illud", which focused on the principles and priorities of Catholic Mission based on the momentous and holy charge in Mark 16:15-"Go into the world and preach the gospel to all creation."

How are we to accomplish this universal mission? The first and most powerful means of fulfilling this, is by living a truly Christian life-a life filled with love, mercy, kindness, compassion and a forgiving spirit. "My life is my message" says Gandhi who often challenged the Christian missionaries of his time, to observe the "apostolate of the rose." The rose doesn't preach. It simply radiates its beautiful and irresistible fragrance.

Secondly, Prayer is the soul of all missionary work. Jesus said: "cut off from me and you can do nothing" (John 15: 5). In the Lukan gospel, he addressed the disciples as follows: "The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few, pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest". (Lk 10: 2).

Thirdly, financial support is necessary for mission work. Of the 3160 Catholic Dioceses in the world, about 1000 are missionary Dioceses-requiring assistance to build Catechetical Programs, Seminaries, Religious Communities, Chapels, Churches, Orphanages and Schools. God's love will be better appreciated when the material needs of the evangelised are provided. Additionally, the sick can experience the healing power of Jesus only through the dedicated service of doctors, nurses, and health care workers. Hospitals and nursing homes require funding. The use of modern media for evangelisation is often necessary to bring Christ's message of love and liberation more effectively to all.

Importantly, every year our contributions across Australia goes in support of the project in different parts of the world. This year's contribution will support the Nazareth Home for Children in the Diocese of Yendi in Ghana, (West Africa) a haven where children are given shelter, nutrition, healthcare and education as well as love and compassion. The support will make sure the children no longer have to fear as the Lord is with them. 'Some give to mission by going, others go to mission by giving'; let us go to mission by giving generously in support of Catholic Mission Australia.

And may the Virgin Mary, who collaborated actively in the beginning of the Church's mission help intercede for all the baptised, to be ever more capable of true love, and so become sources of living water in a spiritually thirsting world in this extraordinary month of mission and Fr Martins always.
