The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

This feast commemorates how Jesus, as a baby, was presented to God in the Temple in Jerusalem. The presentation finds its complete and perfect fulfilment in the mystery of the passion, death and Resurrection of the Lord.

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is a combined feast, commemorating the Jewish practice of the purification of the mother after childbirth and the presentation of the child to God in the Temple and his buying back (redemption) from God. It was known as the Feast of the Purification of Mary, and the Feast of Candlemas. It is also called the Feast of Encounter (Hypapánte in Greek) because the New Testament, represented by the baby Jesus, encountered the Old Testament, represented by Simeon and Anna.

St. Luke, describes how Joseph, presented Mary and the baby Jesus in the Temple for the required purification. It also describes the Holy Family's encounter with the old prophet Simeon and the old prophetess Anna. In his prophecy, Simeon extols the divine blessings which the Messiah is bringing to Israel and to all people and predicts that Mary will play a crucial and sacrificial role in her Son's redemptive work by sharing in his sufferings. In fulfilment of the Mosaic law, Joseph offered two pigeons as sacrifice for the purification and redemption.

The Feast of the presentation of the Lord reminds all the baptised of their initial presentation, dedication and consecration to the Lord.

Although we were officially presented to God on the day of our Baptism, however, at every Holy Mass, we re-present ourselves to God together with our dear ones on the altar through Jesus in the eucharist.

Joseph and Mary in presenting Jesus at the temple represent parents who present their children in church for baptism, at school for admission, at the hospital for medical attention, and to different specialists for training and coaching.

As we celebrate this important feast, we welcome the boys and girls back to school along with the teachers. Special welcome to the 50 boys and girls enrolled at St. Bernard's, who begin Kindergarten this 2020 and their families. And together, we present the 2020 school year to the Lord.
