**M**oses had a tough time in the desert listening to the moaning of the Israelites. They expected better treatment. God said the Promised Land was within their grasp. Are we like those Israelites who are promised something and want it **NOW!** God knows when we are ready but God also wants us to prepare and spend time in prayer listening to the promptings of the Holy Spirit so we can appreciate the gift given.

The hard part is that we may think we deserve better treatment than the 'others' who we feel don't warrant this wonderful gift. God allows the rain to fall on both the good and the bad. God showed so much love for us when we were 'sinners' and 'enemies' and now as his friends ... cf Romans. Who are we to judge?

The beautiful encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan Woman tells us so much about God. Just a couple of thoughts to take away from this Gospel. The human Jesus asks for water... it was hot and he was thirsty. The woman is taken aback...'you are asking me for water?' Jesus' response: 'If only you knew' and that is what Jesus is offering us this Lent. Jesus is offering himself in the Word over these weeks for us to get to know how much God loves us. Are we listening?? Are we willing to accept the 'living water' the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Samaritan woman 'got it' she went racing off to share her experience! We may not 'race off' but we can be witnesses to this great gift by living our faith in our daily lives among the people we encounter each day, who need our listening ear.

In the words of today's Psalm: 'Let us today listen to God's voice: Harden not our hearts' and take the readings into our week as we also celebrate the Feasts of St Patrick and St Joseph. As a Sr of St Joseph, it is one of our big celebrations. What St Joseph offers us is an example of a great listener.

On this feast of Joseph let us ask for the blessing of strength to be still and listen, the fortitude to be patient amidst the many trials and tribulations that confront us at this time and the courage to say yes to the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Sr Marie
