Pentecost literally means 50th. It was a feast of weeks, originally a post-harvest thanksgiving feast celebrated by the Jews 50 days after the Passover, and a remembrance of God's Covenants with Noah after the Deluge and with Moses at Mt. Sinai For Christians, it is a feast celebrated 50th days after the Resurrection of Jesus to

commemorate the full manifestation of the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity in time, fulfilling the promise of Jesus.

On Pentecost day, the Holy Spirit descended upon Mary and the feeble apostles as fiery tongues in an enclosed room, bestowing upon them, the gifts of Wisdom, Understanding, Knowledge, Counsel, Fortitude. Pietv and the Fear of the Lord, transforming them to fierv preachers, teachers, and evangelizers leading to the conversion of over 3000 women and men. This event marked the birth of the Church.

Principally, the Holy Spirit dwells in us (1 Cor. 3:16), strengthens and sanctify us through the Sacraments. In Baptism, the Holy Spirit makes us children of God and heirs of Heaven, in Confirmation temples of God and witnesses to Christ, and effects Gods pardon through absolution in Penance and Reconciliation as reflected in John's Gospel this weekend. In anointing of the sick, the Spirit effects spiritual healing and forgiveness and in the Holy Eucharist, transforms the bread and wine into Jesus' Body and Blood through *Epiclesis* for our spiritual nourishment. Through Holy Orders and Matrimony, the Spirit guides and gives increase to the community of the faithful. The Holy Spirit enables us to pray (Rom. 8.26), teaches, clarifies, and constantly reminds us of Christ's teachings and guides the Magisterium of the Church.

Celebrating the Feast of Pentecost this weekend, let us dispose ourselves by self-emptying to be filled afresh with the gift of the Holy Spirit and be united with all Australians in taking positive steps towards healing especially during this 2020 National Reconciliation Week, as we stand together with the Indigenous Communities and First Australians.

We pray also, for the Boys and Girls in Year Six at St. Bernard's Primary, who are due to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this year. With gratitude and joy, we warmly welcome the nine families that have ioined the Parish since Pentecost 2019.

Happy Pentecost Sunday and happy birthday to the Church!

Reconciliation as Walking Together

During National Reconciliation Week we stop to remember, to listen and to say sorry. We are reminded that Reconciliation is a journey of friendship – our First Australians and those of us whose families came later to Australia, reaching out to each other. Some of us have arrived in Australia after experiencing



aggression and dispossession in our countries of origin and others have lived here for tens of thousands of years and sadly our First Australians have experienced that same dispossession.

The 28th May 2020 marks the 20th Anniversary of the Reconciliation Walk across the Sydney Harbour Bridge in the year 2000, where 250,000 people walked together in an act of unity, calling for true Reconciliation to be realised in this nation. This is still the largest public gathering in Australia's history. All other States and Territories joined in similar walks throughout the year 2000. In 2020 we remember these significant events and together commit to **Still Walking** For Reconciliation.

We are also reminded that the journey of Reconciliation needs to be grounded in truth and action – both personal and as a community. The bushfires and the coronavirus remind us of our shared humanity – we are In This Together.
