The Friendship of God

"I call you friends... not slaves, not servants." These are far from words to be simply 'glazed over'. For they are words Jesus *chooses* to speak to you and I, with no less authenticity as He did to His first followers.

Today, we can lose perspective on how serious and even shocking this talk would have been for the disciples, who first heard them.

It was hard enough grasp the reality of Jesus' identity as the Son of God, but now through these words Jesus was telling them: He wanted a *close, familial, intimate* relationship.

The Greek word that the Gospel uses here for slaves and servant is *doulos*. In the ancient world however this particular term was not a title of shame, but of great honour. Moses was called God's *dulos*, as was the prophet Joshua, David and even Saint Paul. To be *dulos* meant you had been found worthy.

A slave in the ancient world was very different to the idea we have today. The slave, never distant to his master, was actually rather well cared for, valued and even loved (they were an asset after all).

But what Jesus is saying here, is that even this honorific title isn't good enough! Not for His disciples, not for you and I. "I will call you friends" *Philos* – the Greek word for friendship undergirded by love.

We know the stories of Jesus' encounters with others. Yet do we notice that in all of them, whenever Jesus heals someone, He never asks *why* they are sick, how they got sick, what when wrong? Or Where? Rather seeing their faith, He speaks, reaches out, touches and heals.

And why? Because it isn't a case of being worthy. It isn't a case of 'do I have permission to approach, to be in your presence?'

Rather it is Christ's question to us: "Will you take my hand, as my friend, will you enter into my presence? Will you accept my invitation to remain in my love, so that your joy may be complete?"

He seems to say: "You are not one who needs to earn the right to approach me! You are not a slave who needs to seek permission before coming into my presence. Rather, you are my friend, come in and out as you please, and I will continually seek you out!

We always think of ourselves as searching for God and forget that it is *He* who is searching for us. He has been searching in every moment from the time of the Garden; throughout Old Testament, until He comes at last with a human heart that could suffer for want of our love.


Jesus calls us to be friends, and friends therefore of God Himself! Contemplate how strange that must have been for those who stood around Jesus! How strange it is for us!

That is a tremendous offer. It means that no longer do we gaze longingly from afar; we are not slaves who have no right to enter the presence of the Master unless called. **Christian, understand your dignity!** How extraordinary those words that come from Jesus lips today.

"As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you. Remain in my love... that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete."

That is that the purpose for which you were created, friendship with God; don't keep waiting, may it be fulfilled.

First Reading Acts 10:25-26. 34-35. 44-48

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said, 'I am only a man after all!' Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said, 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.' While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.

Second Reading 1 John 4:7-10

My dear people, let us love one another since love comes from God and everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Anyone who fails to love can never have known God, because God is love. God's love for us was revealed when God sent into the world his only Son so that we could have life through him; this is the love I mean: not our love for God, but God's love for us when he sent his Son to be the sacrifice that takes our sins away.

Gospel John 15:9-17

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete. This is my commandment: love one another, as I have loved you. A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends, if you do what I command you, I shall not call you servants any more, because a servant does not know his master's business; I call you friends, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father. You did not choose me, no, I chose you; and then the Father will give you anything you ask him in my name. What I command you is to love one another.'
