The Artisan of 'God's Masterpieces

As human beings we know if we don't breathe, we die. Breath is an essential condition to life. And yet, how often we take this most fundamental, rhythmic, and natural action for granted. We just breathe in and out, awake and asleep, and so life goes on.

Yet isn't it true, that every once in a while we become aware of our breathing, especially when suddenly stuck with shortness of breath!

Occasionally, focusing on what's' taken for granted, can be a refreshing and even revelatory experience; especially for a wounded humanity, so prone to forgetting.

On Pentecost Sunday it is breath that we focus upon! And yet it is not our breath but God's. A Breath that is Life Itself... How often do we contemplate that?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church uses an incredibly beautiful and alluring term for the Holy Spirit, calling Him "the artisan of 'God's masterpieces'" (CCC, 1091). And it is true.

Whenever something happens in Scripture, indeed anywhere... it is always the Holy Spirit, the Divine Breathe and "masterpiece maker", who acts. In the beginning, darkness covers the earth, and the first sound to be heard is God breathing. The breath of God moves across the waters and what was nothing - through God's breath - becomes something!

God then walks in the garden, reaches down and breathes into the soil... and what do we hear? The 'Masterpiece Maker', God's breath, breathes life into clay and there is the human person.

Indeed that Jesus became flesh was only possible when this Divine Breath hovered over the womb of the Virgin Mary (Lk 1:35). And humanity was gifted the Greatest Masterpiece the Universe has ever known, the Master Himself, God now enfleshed!

It's what God the Father did again to raise Jesus from the dead. Jesus lying in the tomb was a corpse; contorted and bruised. Yet when the Father breathes the Holy Spirit into the corpse, Jesus rises into the magnificence of the risen life – never to be destroyed.

Friends that same Breath is now breathed into you and I, Christ's disciples. So that what God the Father did in the beginning to create the human being, he does now to create the Church. The story of Pentecost then, is the story of the 'Masterpiece Maker' now Breathed into us, that we too in Jesus are no longer a corpse, decaying and odorous, going nowhere! But a living Body, capable of living beyond fear and a lock the door.


The Breath of the Holy Spirit reveals to us two things. The first. That the Church is God's own. It's God's Body, imbued with God's Breath... and therefore... God's problem! And because of this, there is no wound, or apparent 'death' which can destroy this Body. For She is enlivened not by human breath, hands, or ideologies... but the Living Breath of God!

The second truth, is that this Breath of God echoes that we are a living Church. A living Body. Who Suffers, of course, but who more truly Grows and Thrives! The Church emergent from Christ's side, and the Upper Room this Pentecost day, is a Body which is breathing - for a Church without Breath is dead!

Friends, with this knowledge and certainly, with all that lay ahead for us personally, and as a church, including our own Archdiocesan Assembly this October (a historic gathering of the Local Church of Canberra and Goulburn) - we say Come Holy Spirit, Artisan of God's Masterpieces! Come into our hearts and lives. Come into the church who forever seeks the new, lifegiving and creative breathe of God. Renew us, your Masterpiece in new and deeper ways.

Entrance Antiphon: The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole word and that which contains all things understands what is said alleluia.

Responsorial: Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth.

Communion Antiphon: They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke of the marvels of God, alleluia.

First Reading Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading Cor 12:3-7, 12-13

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit. There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

Gospel John 20:19-23

In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you. 'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'
