WATSON PARISH RENEWAL 2023/2024

The first meeting of the Inner North Steering Committee was held on 14 December 2023. The Committee, which was convened by Fr Anthony, comprises two representatives from each of the parishes now under the care of the Blessed Sacrament Fathers, typically drawn from each Parish Pastoral Council and the

Finance Council. It is to facilitate coordination between the parishes, each of which is to maintain their separate identity. A key issue is the name for this group of parishes. The views have been sought of each Parish Pastoral Council regarding three options:

1. Inner North Catholic Community

- 2. Catholics @ Inner North
- 3. Blessed Sacrament Community.

The Steering Committee will consider feedback at the next meeting and settle the name.

This year has been one of considerable change in Blackfriars Parish: the withdrawal of the Dominican Order from the parish, the reduction of weekend Masses at Holy Rosary Church from four to three, the ongoing impacts of COVID on Mass attendance, and the retirements of Jacquie Cortese as parish secretary and Jim Smith as longstanding volunteer in the

parish office. The Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) was reestablished mid-year, which was important as the parish also became part of the new parish arrangements for the Catholic community in Canberra's inner north that is now under the care of the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament (SSS). We farewelled Fr Mannes Tellis OP, and we welcomed Fr Renoir Oliver SSS to our parish.

We celebrated 60 years of the parish with the blessing of St Dominic's garden and statue, and enjoyment of a delicious morning tea. It was an opportunity to hear about aspects of the parish's history such as stories of the contribution of parishioners to the life of the parish, and the surrounding community that has included Blackfriars Priory and Signadou (now part of the Australian Catholic University) and Rosary Primary School. Amongst these changes, parish renewal continued through various initiatives and the active participation of the Parish Renewal Team (PRT) members in organising various parish events. Early in the year, PRT members met with the Vicar General, Fr Richard Thompson, and the Chancellor, Patrick McArdle, to discuss the new parish arrangements, offering to work together on the changes. This was followed shortly after by the parish meeting on the new Mass schedule and on parish renewal.

PRT members have facilitated Lenten and Advent preparation programs, and organised a Called and Gifted seminar series that explained the gifts of the Holy Spirit (charisms) and helped participants discern their gifts. In a spirit of collaboration, an invitation was extended beyond the parish.

In September, a partnership of Holy Cross Anglican, Holy Rosary and St Margaret's Uniting Churches ('Holy Roundabout') organised an ecumenical Celebration of Creation, where we prayed and responded to the cry of creation. Another ecumenical event was this month's Nativity Festival, where children and adults alike were able to witness nativity scenes from around the world.

The PRT, working closely with the PPC, hopes – with your input an

d support – to continue the renewal process in conjunction with the inner north Christian community next year and as part of the Archdiocesan Year of the Holy Spirit 2023-2024. More on this and other matters affecting the parish to come. We take this opportunity to welcome Kathie Guillesser, the new parish secretary, and Julie Barnes, the new parish manager, as together we navigate the changes.

We wish you a very happy, safe and holy Christmas and a joyous and peaceful New Year.

ORDINARY TIME

Last week we began what is called "Ordinary time" in the Church calendar. Ordinary does not mean plain or simple. It means "numbered" as in first, second, etc, the ordinal numbers. This was the original sense of the word. Since we are not celebrating major feasts like Christmas or Easter, this title has come to represent a less spectacular or more "average" period in Church celebrations. Because of the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we do not hold a specific 1st Sunday in Ordinary time. It is used for the weekday Masses where no feast or memorial is observed. The numbers are meant to remind us that we are working toward a goal. Our life has a purpose. We are moving toward an ultimate Sunday. That will be observed in heaven when we are joined with the whole company of the saints and angels.
