The wedding feast at Cana engages us as a story of family dynamics, hospitality and festivities. It also contains theologically-loaded words. For example, the wedding takes place on the 'third-day' which, in biblical symbolism suggests the entry of divine power into the narrative—something 'big' is at work here! 'Woman' might seem a rude form of address for a son to his mother; however, in John's gospel 'woman' is used in a revelatory sense, calling to mind the first woman in the creation story, Eve. We are led to understand that creative, and recreative, divine power is at work, and we learn that this is the first of Jesus' signs that 'revealed his glory'. Let's pause to reflect on the human setting for this miracle: a wedding feast. Haven't we all witnessed the innate sacredness of a wedding celebration? That tingling awareness that something incredibly precious is at hand as we witness a bride and groom declaring their life commitment to one another, with family and friends rejoicing? Amid human frailties, the power of love shines through. Weddings are special places and times for divine presence to be manifested and celebrated.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. One may have the gift of preaching with wisdom given him by the Spirit; another may have the gift of preaching instruction given him by the same Spirit; and another the gift of faith given by the same Spirit; another again the gift of healing, through this one Spirit; one, the power of miracles; another, prophecy; another the gift of recognising spirits; another the gift of tongues and another the ability to interpret them. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, who distributes different gifts to different people just as he chooses.

Gospel - John 2:1-11

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' Jesus said 'Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews: each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water', and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now' he told them 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from - only the servants who had drawn the water knew - the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink; but you have kept the best wine till now.'

This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.
