Entrance Antiphon - Cf. Ps 26: 8-9

Of you my heart has spoken, Seek his face. It is your face, O Lord, that I seek; hide not your face from me.

God put Abraham to the test. 'Abraham, Abraham' he called. 'Here I am' he replied. 'Take your son,' God said 'your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you.'

When they arrived at the place God had pointed out to him, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged the wood. Then he bound his son Isaac and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill his son.

But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven. 'Abraham, Abraham' he said. 'I am here' he replied. 'Do not raise your hand against the boy' the angel said. 'Do not harm him, for now I know you fear God. You have not refused me your son, your only son.' Then looking up, Abraham saw a ram caught by its horns in a bush. 'I swear by my own self – it is the Lord who speaks – because you have done this, because you have not refused me your son, your only son, I will shower blessings on you, I will make your descendants as many as the stars of heaven and the grains of sand on the seashore. Your descendants shall gain possession of the gates of their enemies. All the nations of the earth shall bless themselves by your descendants, as a reward for your obedience.'

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus: 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.

INNER NORTH STEERING COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Inner North Steering Committee (2 members from each parish plus the parish priests) met for the 2nd time on Tue 13 Feb. Amongst other items discussed, the committee:

* adopted the name 'Canberra Inner North Catholic Community' following consultations with each Parish;

* adopted Terms of Reference to guide its activities (email the Office if you'd like a copy, with TOR as the subject line);
* agreed to examine collaboration to provide sacramental programs to young people who reside within our Community, but who do not attend Catholic schools within that area;

* agreed to consider constructively and (preferably) respond collectively to a proposal to support an enhanced Youth Ministry across the Community (put forward by the Archdiocesan Youth Ministry Manager, Christopher Gilroy);
* agreed to work together to support an initiative to pursue adult faith formation through participation in an Alpha pro-

gram in the second half of 2024, with participants from each parish and with each parish to provide the venue for 2 or 3 of the 11 sessions;

* noted advice from the Moderator, Fr Anthony, that the priests plan to celebrate the Easter Triduum in all four parishes, with details to be finalised by each Parish Priest;

* received information about evolving financial issues from the (Arch) Diocesan Financial Administrator.

The Committee is aware that this arrangement is a new one and is likely to evolve. Committee Members are working to discern where the Spirit invites us to go, respecting the right of each parish to respond to local circumstances while working in collaboration when that advances the common good.
