In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you', and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.'

Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

IN MEMORY—Archbishop Francis Patrick Carroll DD DCL Hon DLitt

Parishioners will be aware of the passing of one of our most significant Catholic Figures, Arch-Bishop Frank Carroll on 1 4 March 2024 . We thank God for his 70 years of devoted priestly service to the Church, 57 of those as Bishop. He died peacefully at Calvary Hospital in Wagga Wagga.



Frank was born 9 Sept 1930 in Ganmain, NSW to Patrick and Rose-Mary Carroll. He was educated at the Devlin School and St Brendan's Convent, Ganmain before going to high school at De La Salle College, Marrickville; and then studying at Urbanian University, Rome.

He attended Catholic Seminaries in Springwood and Manly. He was ordained a Deacon in 1953 by Cardinal Gilroy before being ordained a priest on 27 July 1954 at St Brendan's Church, Ganmain by Bishop Henschke of Wagga Wagga.

He served in Griffith and Albury and at the Rome Propaganda College DCL He returned to Wagga as Chancellor and Director of Catholic Education in 1965 before being appointed Titular Bishop of Tasaccora and Coadjutor Bishop in 1967, he was made Bishop of the Wagga diocese in 1968 at just 38 years of age. He transferred to the Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn and was installed at St Christopher's Cathedral as Archbishop on 31 August 1983. He served in those role until his retirement in 2006.

A requiem mass was held for Fr Frank at St Christopher's on 21 March and he has been interred in the crypt of the Cathedral.
