The North Deanery Meeting to discuss future of the parishes met recently, with representatives from the Inner North parishes and the Vicar General and the Chancellor for the next phase of discussions for the future plans of the parishes. A representative of our parish was Bill Meani the PPC Chair. There was an overview from each parish and a brief about the coming gaps in our archdiocese, including the loss of 4 priests in 2021 – 2022 (not including Father Paul Nulley) and our future needs. There was also a focus on formation and building on connecting with our local communities. The Vicar General and Chancellor gave an overview of what is not possible and what may be possible in the future. For the next step in the consultation process there will be a meeting after World Youth Day by the same group in late August. There was a positive atmosphere among the group. God's blessings Fr Em
