Death of Pope Francis – With the death of Pope Francis on Easter Monday, 21st April, it has added the reality of what our Easter faith is truly about. We continue to pray for the repose of his soul and in time for the cardinals involved in the election of his successor.

The Funeral Mass - With the funeral for the Pope taking place in Rome on Saturday, 26th April at 6pm our time (at 10am Rome time).

Eternal rest grant unto His Holiness, O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon him. May Pope Francis rest in peace and rise in Easter glory. Amen

Carlo Acutis, an Italian teenager who died of leukemia in 2006, was scheduled to be canonized by Pope Francis on April 27, 2025, unfortunately this has now been postponed due to the passing of the Pope. He will be the first millennial saint recognized by the Catholic Church. Carlo Acutis was beatified (declared Blessed) in 2020. A second miracle was attributed to him in 2024, which paved the way for his canonization. The canonization will take place during the Jubilee of Teenagers, an event at the Vatican from April 25-27, 2025. Acutis was known for his love of computers and his use of technology to spread the Gospel. He was also fascinated by the Eucharist and sought out sites of miracles. His canonization is seen as a way to connect the Church with a new generation of Catholics. Let us pray for our MISSION (Churches of Tumut, Gundagai, Adelong, Batlow and Talbingo), children and grandchildren today through the intercession and protection of Bl. Carlo Acutis. Bl.
